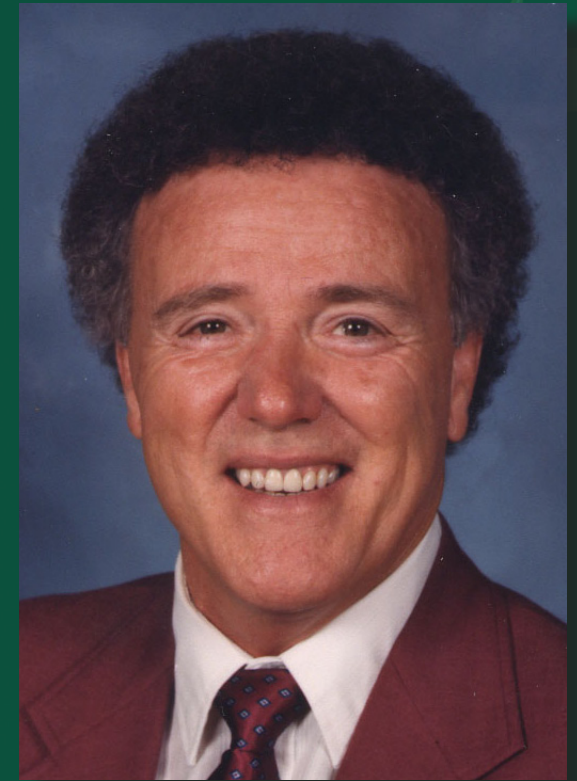

His Story

Lloyd Snelson, also known as "Mr. Hornet", was born in Corning, Calif., on September 1, 1934. Lloyd's infectious smile warms everyone he meets.

An all-around athlete, Lloyd played baseball, basketball, and football at Corning High School and was inducted into the Corning High School Hall of Fame in 1952.

Before transferring to Sacramento State in 1954, Lloyd played football for Shasta Junior College. At Shasta, he also was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame.

Education/ Sacramento State Career

Lloyd graduated from Sacramento State in 1957 with a degree in education and earned a master's degree in 1967. He received his Doctorate from Florida State University in 1977.

A member of the Xi Theta Chi Fraternity, Lloyd was a member of the first two Hornet football teams in school history (1954 and 1955). Lloyd kicked the extra point to help the Hornets defeat Southern Oregon, 7-6, in the season-opening game of the 1955 season. That game also marked the first win for the Hornets in school history.

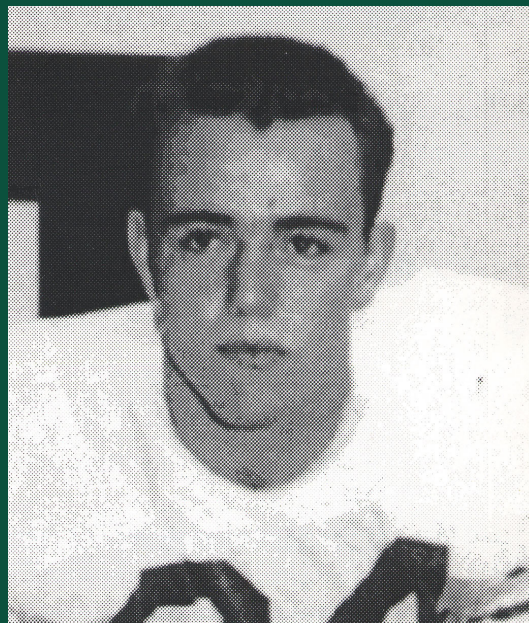
Professional Career

After graduating from Sacramento State, Lloyd served on the USS Chevalier, a Fletcher-class destroyer, in the Pacific from 1958-60.

After his time in the service, Lloyd started his career in education in the Elk Grove, Calif., school district as an elementary school teacher. He later taught physical education at Mira Loma High School then moved into administration, serving as the principal at La Sierra High School, Rio Americano High School and Bella Vista High School until his retirement from the San Juan school district in 1993.

Family

Lloyd has two daughters, Lisa and Kathy, and both were outstanding athletes in their own right. Kathy was a two-time All America in tennis at San Diego State. Lloyd spent countless hours watching his daughters play tennis over the years.

Lloyd has established the Lloyd Snelson Scholarship Endowment within the Department of Athletics at Sacramento State. Allocations for this important endowment will support Hornet football players who have exhausted their eligibility and who need to continue their studies for up to an additional year in order to complete their degree.
