SEASON OUTLOOK

2009 SEASON OUTLOOK

The 2009 Sacramento State Hornets will be without six position starters from a season ago, but will blend an experienced, albeit youthful, pitching staff with returners taking on new roles throughout the diamond.

Gone from last year's squad are all-conference performers Ryan Blair, David Flores, Gabe Jacobo and Wes Oberlin, all of whom hit above .330 last season. Flores' four years at Sacramento State saw him place his name in the record books in several categories, becoming the school's all time leader in doubles, at bats and being hit by a pitch, and ranking second in school history in both hits and runs. He was selected in the 18th round of the MLB Draft by the Houston Astros. Jacobo, who hit .379 with 15 home runs and 66 RBI during his junior season, was selected in the 10th round of the draft by the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim. The 66 runs Jacobo drove in were the second best single-season RBI total in school history. Ryan Blair (21st round) was drafted by the Cleveland Indians following a senior campaign that saw him hit .330 with five home runs and 33 RBI. Oberlin had a monster offensive year during his senior season, hitting .332 with 12 home runs and 40 RBI.

"Those guys all provided power that we hadn't seen in a lineup in a long time," 31st year head coach John Smith said. "Those bats were enjoyable to watch while they were here, but now that they're gone, we have a different makeup that you have to adapt to. This year's team will be an exciting team to watch grow and mature at the plate. They make contact, move runners up, and the thing that has impressed me the most through the fall and the early spring is this team's ability to get hits with runners in scoring position."

The cornerstone of this year's lineup is first team all-Western Athletic Conference performer Tim Wheeler, who hit .330 with three home runs and 43 RBI as a sophomore, while stealing 10 bases and collecting eight outfield assists. Senior Hunter Martinez (.291, .400 obp, six stolen bases) and senior Blake Crosby (.270, three home runs, 25 RBI) make up the other two returning starters.

On the mound, the Hornets return three of their four starters from a season ago, and also welcome the majority of their bullpen back. Junior righthander Trevor York (4-6, 4.97 ERA, 87.0 innings) will miss the beginning of the season recovering from offseason surgery, but senior lefthanders Brian Smith (4-1, 4.75 ERA, 53.0 innings) and Jose Ramirez (4-6, 5.27, 70.0 innings) return to the rotation.

The 12 newcomers, including six true freshmen, as well as the younger returners will gain experience from a tough non-conference schedule that includes four Pac-10 schools and a host of area baseball powers.

"The schedule we have this season satisfies our desires from a RPI standpoint, and also allows our younger players to experience environments that will help in giving them a good college baseball experience," Smith said.

OUTFIELD

Wheeler will be the Hornets opening day starter in center field for the third straight season, and is coming off of a strong summer. Wheeler led the Cape Cod League in stolen bases, competed in the league's all-star game, and led his team, the Orleans Cardinals, in hits. He was named to the Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch List, and was ranked the 38th best collegiate draft prospect and the 88th overall draft eligible prospect by Baseball America during its November preseason rankings.

"Tim is a true baseball player who could play any position on the field," Smith said. "He's been our everyday center fielder for three years and we expect another strong season out of him."

Junior transfer Dan McCarthy is the likely starter in right field after a strong two-year career at Skyline JC in San Bruno, Calif. McCarthy hit .362 as a freshman and .319 as a sophomore, hitting five home runs in two seasons while stealing 16 bases in 18 chances.

"Dan has played really well during the fall, and really earned the chance to be the man for us in right field," Smith said.

Two players look to split time this season in left field, junior Josh Powers and freshman Aaron Crouch. Powers, a righthanded hitter, is a transfer from Cosumnes River JC, after starting his career at the University of the Pacific. He hit .236 with three home runs and 27 RBI last season at Cosumnes, after making 37 appearances, including 24 starts at shortstop as a freshman at Pacific.

"Powers is the jack of all trades on this team," Smith said. "He's going to be on the diamond some place everyday. One day it'll be in left field, one day it'll be at third base, second base, catcher and so-on. He's a very valuable baseball player to this team and if I've ever had a guy in my 31 years as head coach that is willing to do whatever it takes to help us win, it's Josh Powers."

Crouch, a lefthanded hitter, comes to Sacramento State from Yuba City HS, where he was named first team all-area by the *Appeal-Democrat* in 2007 and 2008. As a senior, he hit .326 with three home runs and 19 RBI, while being named the Tri-County Conference Defensive Player of the Year.

"Aaron has made a lot of progress through the fall and is turning into a solid freshman outfielder," Smith said. "He's got a great future here, but for now he's mostly going to play against right-handed pitching while we build his confidence."

Two other players who figure to see time in the outfield are junior Justin Mezzaneras and redshirt freshman Ivan Otsuka. Mezzaneras is a transfer from Sierra JC, where he was a member of the Wolverines 2008 state championship team, posting multi-home run games against Marin and Sac City. Otsuka, a lefthanded batter, was a first team all-Sierra Valley League selection at Oak Ridge HS in 2007 after leading the team in batting with a .371 average.

"Both Ivan and Justin are making steady improvements from day-to-day, and should be key factors in our success this season," Smith said.

Spencer Humphrey, a freshman from Dublin HS, will likely redshirt the 2009 season.





INFIELD

Crosby is the Hornets most experienced infielder, but will begin his third season in the Green and Gold at a new position, third base. He raised his batting average a season ago to .298 during WAC play, driving in 16 runs and posting a .368 on-base percentage. He also laid down a school record 13 sacrifice bunts in 2008.

"Third base is a position that is more suited to Blake and he feels a little more comfortable playing there," Smith said. "From an offensive standpoint, I think he's going to be a leader and we're counting on him to be one of the main bats in our lineup."

Martinez will be the opening day starter at second base, after making 31 starts there a season ago. Martinez went a perfect 6-for-6 on stolen base attempts as a junior, was third on the team in sacrifice hits with six, and contributed three doubles and two triples.

"After playing second base for the first time in a long time last season, Hunter really has a feel for the position now and what he needs to do," Smith said. "We look for Hunter to again be our leadoff hitter and be one of our biggest basestealing threats."

Senior Jeff Roth will expand on his utility role from a season ago, entering the team's starting lineup as the opening day first baseman. Roth, also a pitcher for the Hornets, made 16 appearances as a field player last year, including five starts at designated hitter and one start at second base. He will look to improve on his .185 average from a season ago, which came in limited appearances (27 at bats).

"Roth has not played a lot of first base, but I think once he plays a few games and gets a better feel for it, he can be a very solid first baseman," Smith said.

With Crosby moving to third base, the shortstop position opens up for sophomore Derrick Chung, who made six starts at the position as a true freshman. Chung, who also has pitched in his time at Sacramento State, is known for his arm and range, but also contributed at the plate, hitting .276 last season.

"We're probably not going to be able to utilize Chung as a pitcher this year because he is our main shortstop now, but he will do a good job," Smith said.

Powers and Roth will be primary backups at all four infield positions, with junior Joe España set to back up Roth at first base.

"Joe has made tremendous strides in his ability to hit," Smith said. "He shows signs down the road of being a guy who can add some pop to our lineup."

CATCHER

Sacramento State has four catchers on this year's roster, with one returner and three newcomers to the program.

Sophomore Brent Hottman will be the team's opening day starter at catcher. Hottman made 20 appearances, including 13 starts behind the plate last season, hitting .286 with one home run and 12 RBI, while improving his average to .353 during WAC play. Hottman provided arguably the Hornets biggest hit of the season, a walk-off grand slam on May 16 that defeated the eventual College World Series Champion Fresno State Bulldogs, 9-8.

"Brent has proven that it is his job to lose," Smith said. "He got a lot of game experience last

season and made tremendous strides, especially late in the year, when we had to rest (Travis) Kirkman."

Freshman Justin Lamb, who will back up Hottman, hit .430 with 24 RBI as a senior at Yuba City HS, leading his squad to a 28-3 mark and Tri-County Conference and Sac-Joaquin Section titles. Lamb was named honorable mention all-metro by the *Sacramento Bee* and first team all-area by the *Appeal-Democrat* in 2008.

"Lamb has made tremendous progress as an incoming freshman," Smith said. "His strength right now is his ability to hit collegiate pitching at an early age, overcoming the biggest thing freshmen usually struggle with."

Powers will be the third catcher, with junior transfer Jon Taylor also pushing for time behind the plate.

DESIGNATED HITTER

Lamb will likely be the team's designated hitter to start the 2009 season.

"At this point, we plan on him being in our lineup every day as a designated hitter and backup catcher," Smith said, referring to Lamb.

PITCHING STAFF

Starting pitching will once again play a premium inside of Western Athletic Conference play, because for the second straight year, teams will play four game weekend series.

"With York out to start the year, other players will have an opportunity to step up, and that's a good thing," Smith said. "Our pitching staff is probably where the youth is most visible."

Smith, a native of Sacramento, shined inside of conference play last season, producing all four of his victories inside of the WAC after being moved from the bullpen to the rotation. Smith showed his promise during a late season start against Fresno State where he struck out the first four batters in order. He had minor surgery during the offseason, and will look to be ready to start the season in the rotation for the first time.

Ramirez started the 2008 season strong, earning WAC Pitcher of the Week honors following a win against BYU, and allowing just one run on four hits in 8.2 innings in the team's conference opener against San Jose State in his next start. After that win, however, Ramirez was 1-4 in conference play, and he will look to improve on that mark this coming season.

"Jose and Brian are now seniors and obviously we need those two to be our go-to guys who we can lean on and count on," Smith said. "They have been through a year of the process and are quality, proven pitchers."

A pair of sophomore righthanders, Brandon Sandoval and Chris Baek, are the likely candidates to fill out the rotation.

Sandoval made 16 appearances and three starts during his freshman campaign, posting an 0-2 record with two saves. His best outing of the season was against Fresno State on May 17, as he pitched the final two innings striking out three batters without surrendering a hit on his way to a save as the Hornets shutout the Bulldogs, 4-0.

Baek, who missed time due to injury in the middle of the 2008 season, collected a 1-1 record out of the Hornet bullpen in 13 appearances during his freshman season.

"Brandon and Chris are going to get the opportunity to pitch week after week and get better because of experience," Smith said. "They are

ready to take on the job, and I have confidence in them."

Freshman righthander Jesse Darrah will also be a candidate to crack the starting rotation. Darrah earned first team all-Southwest Sierra League honors at Fowler HS after going 13-2 with a 1.51 ERA and 123 strikeouts in 88 innings during his senior season. He was named first team all-Valley by the *Fresno Bee* and first team all-state small school divisions by *Cal-Hi Sports*.

In the bullpen, the Hornets return several key arms, although they will likely be without the services of two valuable pitchers. Sophomore Trevor Paine, who posted the team's lowest ERA (4.50) and a 3-1 record in 21 appearances, is likely to miss a chunk of time following an offseason injury. Hard-throwing senior righthander Mike Weiss will miss the entire season following Tommy John surgery.

"Trevor, obviously, is a key ingredient in this year's pitching staff," Smith said. "His status for the season is a question mark."

Roth, who served as the team's closer a season ago, will be relied upon out of the bullpen again this year. He tied Paine, and junior Tommy Elrod for the team lead in appearances a season ago (21), posting four saves and a 2-4 record.

"Especially with him playing first base for us, we really have to pick and choose when to use him," Smith said. "We basically wore him out last year at the end of the year because we were throwing him every day."

Senior Eric Fregosi will see his role expand in the bullpen after a strong fall season. Fregosi allowed 10 earned runs in just 7.2 innings pitched a season ago, but has responded positively to changes made in his mechanics by pitching coach Jim Barr.

"The guy that has really turned the corner and made some huge progress for us is Fregosi," Smith said. "His command has improved greatly from what it was last year."

Elrod joined the team late last season, but made an impact both out of the pen and as a Tuesday starter. The lefthander appeared in 21 contests, including two starts, and posted a 1-2 record with one save and a 5.12 ERA.

"Tommy is turning the corner, and is very close to being an impact guy on our staff," Smith said.

Nick Buchta returns for his senior campaign after appearing in nine games, including five starts, a season ago.

"Nick is a guy who gives us flexibility whether as a starter or out of the bullpen," Smith said. "If he plays to his ability, he takes a lot of pressure off other guys."

Freshmen Brent Harrison and Alex Taku, along with junior Brian Filice, make up the newcomers to the Hornet bullpen.

Harrison, a righthander, earned first team all-Sierra Valley Conference honors as a senior after leading Galt HS to its first playoff appearance since 1993.

Taku, a lefthander, was a first team all-Santa Cruz Coast Athletic League honoree as a senior at Santa Cruz HS.

Filice, a righthander, is a transfer from Hartnell JC, where he was named the Coast-South Conference Reliever of the Year after posting a 4-3 mark with four saves as a sophomore.
