Three Dot Data...

NAU has won three consecutive games overall after starting with a loss at Arizona State...The 3-1 start equals the four-game mark of the 2003 team...The Lumberjacks have not won four in a row since a five-game streak in 2003...NAU plays at home for the first time since Sept. 6 and starts a stretch of three home games over four weeks during the month of October...NAU Head Coach Jerome Souers tied the school win mark at 58 against Northern Colorado...The Lumberjacks rank first in the FCS in total defense and total offense...See chart later in the release...Senior K.J. Gerard recorded his third interception of the season and 17th of his career at Southern Utah...He ranks tied for first among active leaders in Division I...NAU is now 23-16 all-time in Big Sky openers with wins in each of the last three seasons...K Robbie Dehaze is two field goals from tying the NAU school record for career field goals set by Penaflo...He enters this week with 46...He missed his first FG attempt at UNC, stopping a career-best streak of nine consecutive field goals...

Tough Against the Run...

NAU leads the FCS and Division I overall in rushing defense allowing just 9.0 yards per game after holding its last three opponents to negative yards rushing. For the season, NAU has allowed 36 yards on 82 carries (0.44 yards per carry) with a season-long carry of 13 yards with 31 plays for zero or negative yardage on the season.

NAU Earns First Ranking...

NAU is ranked by three Football Championship Subdivision polls announced Monday, the first national ranking for the program in four seasons. The Lumberjacks are listed at No. 24 by The Sports Network, the FCS Coaches Poll and AnyGivenSunday.com. It is the first national ranking for the Lumberjacks since Oct. 9, 2004 when NAU was listed at No. 14 before a loss at Eastern Washington.

Cardiac Jacks...

NAU has won two consecutive games sealed in the final minutes. Senior K.J. Gerard made an interception in the end zone with 23 seconds remaining to preserve a 19-14 win at Southern Utah. SUU quarterback Cody Stone led the Thunderbirds to the NAU 2-yard line and the verge of the game-winning points. But NAU then stopped back-to-back rushing attempts, forcing SUU back to the six-yard line. Gerard then intercepted the Cody Stone pass that was intended for Poots in the right corner of the end zone on third down. Against UNC, Josh Luck picked up a fumbled trick play on a extra-point attempt for a defensive PAT to secure the 25-22 win. The Bears had pulled within 23-22 on a 21-yard pass from Bryan Waggener to Brandon Smith with 1:09 left in the game. Looking for their first win of the season, UNC went for two points out of a trick formation but the ball ended up on the ground where Luck picked it up and ran it back the length of the field. NAU covered the on-side kick and ran out the clock.

Road Kill...

NAU has won five consecutive FCS road games, including four Big Sky road contests dating to the loss at Sacramento State last season.

Kriesien Reaches 1,000...

QB Lance Kriesien surpassed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for his career against Northern Colorado. He has 1,031 career yards entering this week.

All in the Family...

NAU is 33-18 all-time in Family Weekend games.

Big Sky Coaches Preseason Polls

Northern Arizona, which is coming off back-to-back 6-5 seasons, was picked third by the coaches and fourth by the media in the league's preseason polls, released at the Summer Kickoff in Park City, Utah. The Lumberjacks earned one first-place vote from the coaches.

Montana was picked first by the media and coaches in the league's preseason polls. They has won or shared a record 10 straight Big Sky Conference football titles. Montana, which has won 16 straight conference games and went 11-0 in the 2007 regular season, earned seven first-place votes from the coaches and 63 total points. The Grizzlies garnered 23 of 43 first-place votes from the media, and 361 total points.

Williams Has Big Game...

Freshman RB Deonte Williams had a career-best 127 yards and two touchdowns on 34 carries in his first career start. He has 84 carries on the season for 330 yards.

Early Impact...

In addition to Williams, several freshmen have had early impacts for the Lumberjacks. Oscar Alvarez is handling the long snapping duties. Blayne Anderson is in the rotation on the defensive line with five tackles and two sacks in four games. Austin Shanks is averaging 20.7 yards per kick return. Overall, eleven freshmen saw action in the opener at Arizona State, including six true freshmen (Shanks, D. Williams, Molino, Ragland-Johnsen, Sienkiewicz and Anderson).

Top Offense...

NAU has the top offense in the nation after four games, averaging 475.5 yards per game. The Lumberjacks also rank among the top 20 in rushing (15th-212.0 ypg) and passing (20th-263.5 ypg).

Big Sky Leaders...

NAU leads the conference in eight statistical categories after four games.

Series History...

NAU and Sacramento State have met 13 times with the Lumberjacks holding a 8-5 advantage in the series. The home team has won the last four games in the series. See 2007 recap later in the release.

Team Player...

QB Lance Kriesien entered the game in the third quarter against Southern Utah at running back when Alex Henderson left the game. He recorded 75 yards on the ground on 12 carries, including the game-winning rush in the fourth quarter after taking over at quarterback. He also went 4-for-5 for 37 yards passing and had two receptions for 10 yards.

Meagher Returns...

C Kevin Meagher returned last week after missing all of 2007 from injuries suffered in an offseason car accident. He started all 11 games at center in 2006, earning Big Sky honorable mention honors. NAU used its fourth differ-

ent starting line this week and fourth center of the season after the injury to Jeff Hines in week one at Arizona State.

Top Showing...

NAU gained 772 yards of total offense against the New Mexico Highlands, shattering the school record set in 1989 against Nevada of 674. It is the highest total in Division I this season, including both the FBS and FCS.

First Miss...

P/K Robbie Dehaze missed his first field goal attempt at UNC, ending a career-best streak of nine consecutive field goals. The 31-yard attempt was his first career miss between 30-39 yards after going 8-for-8 from the distance entering the game. He is now 6-for-7 on the season with 15 consecutive extra-point attempts dating to last season.

Overlooked Milestone...

Sometime in the first half offensive explosion RB Alex Henderson became the eighth running back in school history to surpass 2,000 career yards against New Mexico Highlands.

Former Quarterback Signs with Tennessee Titans...

The Tennessee Titans added former Northern Arizona quarterback Preston Parsons to the practice squad on Sept. 8. Parsons played at NAU from 1998-01 and has been with the Arizona Cardinals (2002-03), Houston Texans (2004-05) and Denver (2006-07) in the NFL.

Parsons led the NAU squad to NCAA I-AA playoffs during his senior season and finished his career seventh on the NAU passing charts for passing yardage, passing attempts and pass completions. A native of Beaverton, Ore., Parsons threw only three interceptions in 296 attempts during the 2001 season (0.101) and had a streak of 158 attempts without a pick before an interception at Sacramento State. He posted a career-high 19 touchdown passes to just three interceptions in 2001.

Parsons represents the only former Lumberjack currently with a NFL orga-

nization. Paul Ernster was recently cut by the Pittsburgh Steelers and Keith O'Neil retired from the New York Giants last spring.

Parsons is one of five former Lumberjack quarterbacks who have played in the NFL. Overall, sixty-eight former Lumberjacks have played professional football after playing in Flagstaff.

Did You Know...

Over the last two years a former Lumberjack has won a Super Bowl title (Keith O'Neil with the Colts in 2007) and Grey Cup title (Airiban Justin with the Saskatchewan Roughriders in 2007).

All-America Status...

NAU placed four players on the pre-season Sports Network All-America team and the Big Sky Conference had 18 athletes selected when the squad was announced August 22. NAU was one of three schools with four players on the team. Northern Arizona landed cornerback **K.J. Gerard** and punter **Robbie Dehaze** on the first team, while safety **Cyrus Igono** and tight end **Shaun Fitzpatrick** were third-team selections.

Dehaze Among Nation's Best at Both...

Senior Robbie Dehaze, who was named to The Sports Network All-America preseason team in 2008 at kicker, ranks sixth in the nation in punting (44.3) and tied for 10th in field goals per game (1.5). He is the only player in the country to rank among the top 10 in both categories. He has made 46-of-61 career field goal attempts (75.4 percent), the ninth-best active field goal percentage in the FCS.

Defending Our Turf...

For the fourth time since it was built, the J. Lawrence Walkup Skydome received a new football playing surface.

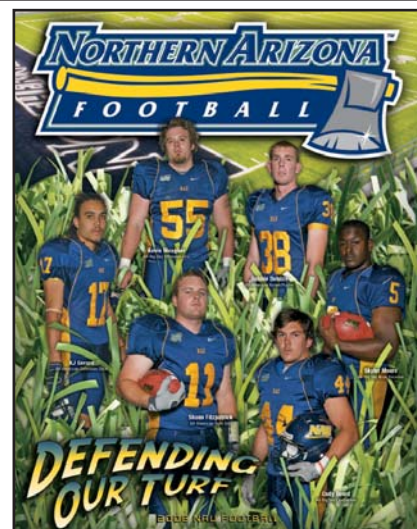
Installation of a removable REALGRASS™ Matrix system began on April 7 and was completed for the annual NAU Spring Football Game. It is the first removable REALGRASS™ system to be installed in the United States.

Getting new turf installed in the Skydome was one of the priorities in a report released in January by the President's Task Force on Athletics Facilities. Plans also call for two recreational surfaces to be installed on campus.

The installation of the turf was done by the Hellas Construction firm of Austin, Texas. The carpet, the Matrix version of the brand REALGRASS™ cost close to \$1 million, according to Skydome Director Dave Brown. The REALGRASS™ Matrix system is comprised of a monofilament spinneret yarn in two different sizes and colors.

"The REALGRASS™ Matrix is the most advanced and exclusive turf available and we are exhilarated that it is being installed in the Skydome," said Head Coach Jerome Souers. "I am confident this facility supports a safer and more rewarding experience for those who compete on it."

The REALGRASS™ surface is the same one under consideration for the Dallas Cowboys' new stadium.

Souers Among Big Sky Best...

NAU Head Coach Jerome Souers tied the school win mark at 58 against Northern Colorado. He is sixth on the Big Sky win list entering this week. In his 11th season at the helm of the program, he has the longest tenure of any football coach in school history. He is one of seven coaches in conference history to coach his team for 100 or more games. The others...Don Read, Montana; Chris Ault, Nevada; Dave Arslanian, Weber State; Tim Walsh, Portland State; Mike Kramer, EWU/MSU. See chart on Souers bio later in the release.

Gerard Among Active Leaders...

Senior K.J. Gerard is tied for first among the NCAA active leaders in the Football Championship Subdivision and Division I overall. He is tied with David Hyland of Morehead State for the lead in FCS and Division I overall. Gerard was named to the Associated Press (third team) and The Sports Network All-America teams in 2007. He has three interceptions this season, ranking tied for 12th with a 0.75 per game average this season in the FCS.

Is There Something in the Air?

Dallas Cowboys Defensive Coordinator Brian Stewart is the latest in a line of successful NFL coaches with NAU ties. Stewart played at NAU from 1986-87 and was an assistant in 1995. Three current NFL coaches have roamed the sidelines in the Walkup Skydome, including Brad Childress (Minnesota Vikings), Andy Reid (Philadelphia Eagles) and Mike Shanahan (Denver Broncos). Overall, five former Lumberjack assistants have led a National Football League franchise. Bill Callahan was the coach of the Oakland Raiders and current Philadelphia assistant Marty Mornhinweg was the head coach of the Detroit Lions. Joe Barry (Detroit Lions), Darrell Bevell (Vikings), Jeff Imamura (Vikings), Derek Mason (Vikings), Pat Morris (Vikings), Frank Pollack (Texans), Dante Scarnecchia (Patriots) and Ken Zampese (Bengals) complete the list. Record Watching...

* RB Alex Henderson became the eighth running back in school history to surpass 2,000 career yards against New Mexico Highlands. He has 2,156 yards to rank fifth on the all-time list, 77 yards behind David Estrada (2,233) for fifth.

* Dehaze has been named the Special Teams Player of the Week two times this season (9/1, 9/22). He earned his first honor after the Arizona State when he made two field goals and averaged 47.3 yards per punt. Against Southern Utah, Dehaze made a pair of 32-yard field goals and also averaged 44 yards on six punts, with a long of 55. Three of his punts were downed inside the 20-yard line. Dehaze has now earned the honor four times in his career.

What They're Saying...

HEAD COACH JEROME SOUERS

On Special Teams play at UNC...

"Special teams were huge for them and then for us at the end. We have some things we need to figure out on our punt team. I was so proud of our defense. They played great inspirational football and made the plays when they had to help secure the game."

On the Defensive Play...

"There were a lot of adjustments going on both sides of the line of scrimmage. They were doing some things and we were some things. It was a great chess match there. Obviously there are a lot of things we need to clean up. I am proud of our guys. They battled and made the plays when they needed to get the win."

On Deonte Williams...

"He ran the ball well. He slipped a few times. We had some seems that could have been bigger today but it starts with the offensive line. I thought the offensive line did a nice job. It was good to get Kevin Meagher back."

The Last Meeting...

SACRAMENTO STATE 38, NORTHERN ARIZONA 9 GAME 5 - SEPT. 29, 2007 - SACRAMENTO, CALIF. HORNET STADIUM (6,194)

Sacramento State used two big plays in the first half to take an early lead and cruise to a 38-9 win in its home opener at Hornet Stadium. The Lumberjacks were hampered by key injuries in the largest loss to Sacramento State in school history.

NAU struggled on offense all afternoon, failing to convert a third down attempt in the game. Quarterback Lance Kriesien missed the second half due to injury, putting the game in the hands of backup Ricky Odorfer.

NAU managed just 70 yards in the second half while the Hornets scored three times and totaled 212 offensive yards, amassing over 400 yards for the game.

Hornet quarterback Jason Smith went 13-for-32 for 233 yards and two touchdowns, as well as 31 yards on the ground with a score. Running back Bryan Hilliard added 100 yards and a touchdown.

Sacramento limited NAU to 85 yards rushing and 102 yards passing. Alex Henderson led the Lumberjacks with 39 yards. Kriesien went 9-for-14 for 48 yards, while Odorfer completed three of 12 passes for 54 yards.

Sacramento State scored first on a 74-yard pass from Jason Smith to Ryan Coogler with 9:40 left in the second quarter, converting a short 10-yard pass into the Hornets longest play of the season.

The teams exchanged field goals, including a 22-yard effort by Robbie Dehaze to give Sacramento a 10-3 lead just before the half. With just 14 seconds left in the half, the Hornets' Dyland Lane picked off Kriesien and ran the ball back 60 yards for a touchdown for a 17-3 halftime advantage.

With Kriesien, who was hurt early in the game, out during the second half, NAU managed just one offensive score on a 22-yard pass from Odorfer to Alex Watson with 5:02 left in the third quarter as the Hornets led 24-9. The extra-point was blocked, ending a strak of 42 consecutive made by Dehaze.

Entering his 11th year as head coach of the Northern Arizona football program, Jerome Souers, the dean of the Big Sky Conference coaches, has taken the Lumberjack program to new heights. After back-to-back winning season, Souers has the Lumberjacks poised for a run at the playoffs in 2008.

Under Souers NAU made a record-breaking NCAA I-AA Quarterfinal appearance in 2003, won the first Big Sky Conference title since 1978, recorded two playoff berths and posted six winning seasons. During his 10-year tenure, Souers has coached 78 student-athletes to all-conference honors a combined 124 times with 30 first-team selections and 26 All-Americans accolades.

Souers, who was named the 1999 Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year in a vote by his colleagues, also has the Lumberjacks posting impressive results in the classroom. The football program has produced the Golden Eagle Scholar Athlete of the Year six times in the last eight years (Blair Boynton, Eric Damko, Steve Gomez, Mark Gould, Paul Ernster and Jeff Wheeler) and had nine student-athletes named to the 2007 Big Sky Fall All-Academic team. Overall, 45 student-athletes have earned 81 Big Sky academic honors over the last 10 seasons. There have also been five Academic All-Americans, as well.

But there is still work ahead. After finishing third in the league in 2007, the Lumberjacks are ready to contend again this season. Souers, who has coached a national champion, strives everyday to get his Lumberjack program in position to play for the title not just a playoff appearance or high ranking. And the 2003 season was his best effort to date, earning him finalist honors for the 2003 Eddie Robinson Award, an award presented by The Sports Network to the top head coach in I-AA football.

Behind the play of true freshman Big Sky Offensive Player of the Year Jason Murrietta, the Lumberjacks upset top-seeded McNeese State on the road and played host to the first home playoff game since 1996 with a quarterfinal appearance against Florida Atlantic. NAU finished ranked 10th in the national polls as Souers' players were honored on and off the field for their performances. Eighteen players were recognized with All-Big Sky

honors highlighted by first-team All-America accolades for punter Mark Gould, who was recognized by five different organizations. Gould led the accolades off the field, too. He was a CoSIDA Academic All-America selection for the second consecutive season as NAU led the nation with five CoSIDA academic all-district selections.

In 2006, Murrietta led a reemergence that produced significant improvements in the offensive production, resulting in a winning season with six wins and ranking among the top turnarounds in the country. Murrietta had a stellar senior season highlighted by a runner-up finish for the Walter Payton Award, All-America honors and his second Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Year award. He threw for 2,827 yards with a 65.0 completion percentage and a school-record 34 touchdowns, leading the Big Sky in passing efficiency (168.2) and total offense (243.1), while ranking fifth and 11th nationally.

Souers arrived in Flagstaff after spending 12 years at Montana with a proven track record. His last eight seasons in Missoula he served as defensive coordinator. During his stay with the Grizzlies, Montana was transformed from a Big Sky also-ran into a perennial league and national title contender. Souers' tenure in Missoula produced 12 straight winning seasons, seven playoff berths, four appearances in the national semifinals, a national runner-up finish (1996) and a national title (1995). Montana won three Big Sky titles during that span.

Practice attendance is a privilege that will be revoked with the publication of any strategy, game plan or injury-related information that may be obtained during practice observation.
