Three Dot Data...

NAU will play three consecutive road games starting at Sacramento State...NAU has won four consecutive games...It is the fifth streak of four or more wins under Souers and longest since NAU won six consecutive last season...The Lumberjacks play five of the final seven regular season games on the road...NAU has won two consecutive road games...Senior running back Alex Henderson needs just 27 yards to reach 3,000 yards in his career, the third player in school history...QB Michael Herrick ranks second in the conference in both passing efficiency (161.11) and total offense (294.6) and among the top 10 in the nation in both categories...Herrick has not thrown an interception in four games spanning 142 attempts while throwing nine touchdowns.

Football Moves up in Rankings...

The Lumberjacks are ranked as high as No. 21 by The Sports Network FCS College Football poll and appear in both prominent national polls for the second consecutive week. The Lumberjacks are also ranked No. 22 in the FCS Coaches Poll.

Offensive Notes...

* NAU ranks sixth in the country in passing offense (305.6) and second in the Big Sky behind only Weber State.
 * NAU has thrown for 300 or more yards in three of the seven games this season, including a season-high 463 yards against Montana.
 * NAU ranks first in the conference and fourth in the country in pass efficiency.
 * QB Michael Herrick ranks second in the conference in both passing efficiency (161.11) and total offense (294.6) and among the top 10 in the nation in both categories.

Defensive Notes...

* NAU has held their opponents to less than 100 yards rushing in four of the last five contests.
 * After allowing 365 rushing yards to FBS opponent Arizona in the opener, NAU has allowed just 77.1 yards per game rushing over the last six games and 70.8 yards per game in Big Sky play.
 * NAU has allowed just one rushing touchdown in the last four games.
 * NAU allowed a season-low 274 yards of total offense against Portland State and has held each of the last three opponents under 300 yards.
 * NAU forced 10 turnovers over the last three games and leads the Big Sky Conference in turnover margin.

* NAU allowed fewer yards of total offense by their opponent in five consecutive games after the Arizona game.

Special Teams Notes...

* Kicker Matt Myers, Big Sky Special Teams Player of the Week, is 10-of-12 on the season on field goal attempts and has made seven consecutive overall. He is 27-for-27 on extra-point attempts.
 * NAU is 22nd in the nation in kickoff returns.

Lumberjacks in the Pros

K.J. Gerard, who graduated from NAU in 2008, was signed to the Baltimore Ravens practice squad on Sept. 6, securing a job in the NFL as the an undrafted free agent. He is the fourth NAU player since 2000 to earn a job in the NFL as an undrafted free agent.

DID YOU KNOW: In 2007, a former Lumberjack won both a Super Bowl title (Keith O'Neil with the Colts in 2007) and Grey Cup title (Airiban Justin with the Saskatchewan Roughriders in 2007).

Souers Moves Up Big Sky List....

Head Coach Jerome Souers won his 66th career victory against Idaho State, moving past former PSU head coach Tim Walsh for fifth all-time in conference history. Only current Montana coach Bobby Hauck and former coaches Chris Ault (Nevada), Don Reed (Montana) and Mike Kramer (EWU/MSU) have won more games in conference history. Souers became the all-time winningest coach in school history in 2008, surpassing Max Spilsbury's 58 wins from 1956-64. He has the longest tenure of any football coach in school history. He is one of seven coaches in conference history to coach his team for 100 or more games. The others...Don Read, Montana; Chris Ault, Nevada; Dave Arslanian, Weber State; Tim Walsh, Portland State; Mike Kramer, EWU/MSU.

Series History...

NAU leads the all-time series 9-5 but has lost the last two meetings in Sacramento. The Lumberjacks are 4-2 all-time in Sacramento. NAU won 42-10 last year in Flagstaff.

E-S-T-R-A-D-A...

*Junior Matt Estrada leads the team with 43 tackles in seven games with a team-best 33 solo tackles. He has recorded at least seven tackles in four of seven games and had 10 or more two times.

Spreading the Wealth...

* NAU is the only team in the nation to have two receivers among the top 20 in the nation in receptions per game with Ed Berry (6.71, T14th) and Conrad Meadows (6.29, T20th).

* Ed Berry is one of five players in the country averaging 100 or more yards per game.

* Six different players have caught touchdown passes this season with five with two or more and four with three or more.

* 13 different players have caught passes this season.

Berry, Berry Good...

Senior wide receiver Ed Berry had a career-best 12 catches for 182 yards against Montana State, the 13th-best single-game yardage total in school history. The 12 catches were two short of the school record. Berry leads the conference in catches per game and ranks tied for 14th in the nation. He is first in the Big Sky and fifth in the nation in receiving yards per game.

Injury Impact...

NAU has had 15 players miss games due to injury who have combined to miss 68 games so far this season. Twelve of the 15 players have come from the defensive side of the ball, a group that includes seven players who were projected starters entering spring practice who have made 66 career starts. Overall, NAU has 92 career starts represented in the injured players.

The Replacements...

NAU has had several player step up to play significant roles after starting the season second or lower on the depth chart due to the injuries. Overall, 13 players have made their first start this season with 10 on defense and three on offense.

Henderson's Big Game...

Senior RB Alex Henderson has now rushed for 160 or more yards in a game two times this season, including a season-high 168 against Southern Utah. He was named the Big Sky Co-Offensive Player of the Week for his performance against SUU. It was his best individual performance since rushing for 265 against Eastern Washington as a freshman. The 32 carries were a career single-game high and third most in the FCS this season.

More Henderson...

Henderson surpassed Allan Clark for third-place on the school rushing chart against Northern Colorado. He now needs 27 yards to reach 3,000 yards for his career. His career total is the 10th-best active mark in the FCS.

Big Play Machine...

DE Issac Bond has played in all seven games and been a big play machine with 8.0 tackles for loss with 6.5 sacks on the season. He has added four pass deflections, four quarterback hurries, one interception and one forced fumble. He ranks tied for seventh overall with 31 tackles.

Sweet Sweeney...

Senior wide receiver Curt Sweeney had one catch in the first two games but broke out with five catches for a career-high 148 yards and three touchdowns against fourth-ranked Montana.

Berry-licious...

Berry led the team in receptions in 2008 but never caught a touchdown pass. He ended that streak in the season opener against Arizona with his first two scoring receptions among seven receptions against the Wildcats. He had seven receptions for 71 yards with two touchdowns.

Punter U...

NAU has had a strong punting tradition this decade, ranking among the top five national leaders in punting eight straight seasons and top 10 over nine consecutive seasons.

* NAU opened the season at Arizona (5-2) ranked No. 23 in the Associated Press poll this week and play at Ole Miss in two weeks. The Rebels are ranked No. 24 this week. The Lumberjacks also faced Montana earlier this season, the No. 2 team in the nation in FCS. Montana State was ranked No. 24 when NAU defeated the Bobcats in Bozeman.

Season Highlights...

Big Victory: NAU recorded its first victory over a ranked team since its win at No. 1 ranked McNeese State in 2003, breaking a streak of 19 consecutive losses to ranked teams at the FBS and FCS levels with the win at Montana State.

Quick Strike : NAU's three second-half scores against Northern Colorado totaled five plays for 213 yards for a 42.6 average yards per play. Two of the drives resulted in touchdowns on the first play with Alex Henderson scampering 69 yards and Ed Berry conducting a catch and run for 81 yards.

Bond Earns Big Sky Honor: Defensive lineman Isaac Bond was named the Co-Defensive Player of the Week by the Big Sky Conference for his performance Oct. 3 along with Montana State's Michael Rider.

Bond, a 6-4, 240-pound sophomore from Vancouver, Wash., tallied 10 tackles - five solo - with two sacks, 3.5 tackles per loss, two quarterback hurries, a forced fumble and a pass breakup in Northern Arizona's 35-27 home win over Northern Colorado. Bond and the NAU defense held the Bears to three straight field goal attempts in the fourth quarter after Northern Colorado advanced inside the Lumberjacks' 20-yard line and stopped the final drive on the 2-yard line. This is Bond's first Player of the Week honor.

Herrick Has Record Day:

Quarterback Michael Herrick had a career-day against fourth-ranked Montana. He finished the game 36-for-49 passing for a career-high 445 yards and four touchdowns. The 445 passing yards were the third-best single-game performance in school history and most by a NAU quarterback since 1997. It also set a Walkup Skydome mark for individual passing yards, breaking the 19-year old mark set by NAU's John Bond of 424 yards set against Nicholls State in 1990. Travis Brown is the only other NAU quarterback to throw for more yards in a game, throwing for 452 yards at Weber State in 1997 and 474 at Montana in 1996. Herrick's 445 passing yards are the third-most in the FCS this season.

Overtime: The overtime game with Montana was the first overtime game in the Walkup Skydome since 1996 and just the fourth in school history. NAU last played in an overtime game in 2004 at Stephen F. Austin, losing 24-17.

Herrick Earns BSC Honor: Junior quarterback Michael Herrick was named the Big Sky Co-Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in the upset win at Montana State.

Herrick completed 30 of 40 passes (75 percent) for 388 yards with one touchdown and no interceptions in Northern Arizona's 23-10 upset of No. 24 Montana State in Bozeman, Mont. Herrick threw a 14-yard TD pass to Ed Berry with 4:43 to play, giving the Lumberjacks' a 20-10 lead. The 388 yards was the 13th-best single-game effort in school history. This is Herrick's first Player of the Week honor. Herrick shared the award with Montana wide receiver Marc Mariani.

Big Sky Coaches Preseason Polls

The Northern Arizona football team was picked fifth by media and coaches in the 2009 preseason polls released by the conference on Tuesday, with Montana selected first in both polls, and 2008 co-conference champion Weber State picked second.

Northern Arizona Head Coach Jerome Souers became the all-time winningest coach in school history as his 24th-ranked Lumberjacks posted a 42-10 win over Sacramento State. NAU won for the fourth consecutive time.

Souers recorded his 59th career victory in his 11th season, surpassing Max Spilsbury's 58 wins from 1956-64.

NAU entered the game with the nation's top rushing defense and they did not disappoint again. The Lumberjacks allowed just 21 yards on 41 carries, while holding the Hornets out of the end zone over the final 57 minutes of the game. Anthony Llanos had a game-high 10 tackles for the Lumberjacks. The defense recorded eight sacks, two interceptions and fumble recovery in the game along with four pass deflections.

Senior quarterback Lance Kriesien had a productive game, throwing for 256 yards and two touchdowns. He connected with junior Ed Berry four times for 68 yards. Tight end Brian Riley had two catches for a team-best 85 yards, including a 56-yard touchdown score. Overall, the running game gained 112 yards with 47 from Deonte Williams and 41 from Austin Shanks.

In his 12th year as head coach of the Northern Arizona football program, Jerome Souers, the dean of the Big Sky Conference coaches, has taken the Lumberjack program to new heights.

Under Souers NAU made a record-breaking NCAA I-AA Quarterfinal appearance in 2003, won the first Big Sky Conference title since 1978, recorded two playoff berths and posted seven winning seasons. During his 11-year tenure, Souers has coached 90 student-athletes to all-conference honors a combined 142 times with 34 first-team selections and 36 All-Americans accolades.

Souers, who was named the 1999 Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year in a vote by his colleagues, also has the Lumberjacks posting impressive results in the classroom. The football program has produced the Golden Eagle Scholar Athlete of the Year six times in the last nine years (Blair Boynton, Eric Damko, Steve Gomez, Mark Gould, Paul Ernster and Jeff Wheeler) and had seven student-athletes named to the 2008 Big Sky Fall All-Academic team. Overall, 50 student-athletes have earned 88 Big Sky academic honors over the last 11 seasons. There have also been five Academic All-Americans, as well.

The football program has shown a demonstrated record of improvement in its Academic Progress Rate (APR), recording a single-year APR of 951 and multi-year rate of 919 from the most recent statistics in 2007-08.

But there is still work ahead. Souers, who has coached a national champion, strives everyday to get his Lumberjack program in position to play for the title not just a playoff appearance or high ranking.

And the 2003 season was his best effort to date, earning him finalist honors for the 2003 Eddie Robinson Award, an award presented by The Sports Network to the top head coach in I-AA football.

Behind the play of true freshman Big Sky Offensive Player of the Year Jason Murrietta, the Lumberjacks upset top-seeded McNeese State on the road and played host to the first home playoff game since 1996 with a quarterfinal appearance against Florida Atlantic. NAU finished ranked 10th in the national polls as Souers' players were honored on and off the field for their performances. Eighteen players were recognized with All-Big Sky

honors highlighted by first-team All-America accolades for punter Mark Gould, who was recognized by five different organizations. Gould led the accolades off the field, too. He was a CoSIDA Academic All-America selection for the second consecutive season as NAU led the nation with five CoSIDA academic all-district selections.

In 2006, Murrietta led a reemergence that produced significant improvements in the offensive production, resulting in a winning season with six wins and ranking among the top turnarounds in the country. Murrietta had a stellar senior season highlighted by a runner-up finish for the Walter Payton Award, All-America honors and his second Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Year award. He threw for 2,827 yards with a 65.0 completion percentage and a school-record 34 touchdowns, leading the Big Sky in passing efficiency (168.2) and total offense (243.1), while ranking fifth and 11th nationally.

Souers arrived in Flagstaff after spending 12 years at Montana with a proven track record. His last eight seasons in Missoula he served as defensive coordinator. During his stay with the Grizzlies, Montana was transformed from a Big Sky also-ran into a perennial league and national title contender. Souers' tenure in Missoula produced 12 straight winning seasons, seven playoff berths, four appearances in the national semifinals, a national runner-up finish (1996) and a national title (1995). Montana won three Big Sky titles during that span.

Northern Arizona forced five turnovers and threw for almost 400 yards to upset 24th-ranked Montana State on the road 23-10 in front of 14,017 fans at Bobcat Stadium.

It was the first victory for the Lumberjacks over a ranked team since its win at No. 1 ranked McNeese State in 2003, breaking a streak of 20 consecutive losses to ranked teams at the FBS and FCS levels.

Quarterback Michael Herrick threw for 388 yards and hit wide receiver Ed Berry for a 14-yard score late in the fourth quarter to seal the victory. The touchdown was setup by a fumble recovery by Matt Estrada off a Bobcat punt.

Berry finished with 12 catches for a game-high 182 yards.

Sophomore kicker Matt Myers put the Lumberjacks up for good with his second field goal in the fourth quarter, giving NAU a 13-10 advantage in the game.

The two field goals erased a MSU lead taken when they recovered a fumbled punt on the NAU 2-yard line late in the third quarter, scoring on the next play from scrimmage on a Mark Iddins pass to Kyle Begger. But the NAU defense held the Bobcats scoreless over the final quarter, forcing two turnovers to eliminate any comeback attempt.

NAU took a lead at halftime with a score right before the half. Daiveun Curry-Chapman hit Fitzpatrick with a jump pass out of a Wildcat formation. It completed a 12-play, 92-yard drive and got the Lumberjacks on the scoreboard. Curry-Chapman jumped as he threw the short pass to a diving Fitzpatrick, who made a nice catch just off the ground.

Quarterback Michael Herrick threw for three touchdowns and the rushing attack gained over 200 yards as Northern Arizona won its third consecutive game with a 44-23 victory over Portland State at PGE Park.

Herrick completed 21-for-34 passes for 254 yards with three touchdowns without throwing an interception for the third consecutive game.

Senior running back Alex Henderson had 21 carries for 97 yards with two touchdowns, while sophomore Giovannie Dixon added 78 yards on 10 carries with one touchdown.

Senior running back Alex Henderson rushed for 132 yards and two touchdowns to lead No. 24 Northern Arizona to a 40-12 victory over Idaho State on Homecoming. The Lumberjacks won for the fourth consecutive game in front of a crowd of 9,687 at the Walkup Skydome.

Henderson gained 7.8 yards per carry on 17 carries for 132 yards, recording his third 100-yard rushing game of the season and 10th of his career. He scored a pair of touchdowns in the second quarter when the Lumberjacks pulled away from Idaho State with 20 points.

ISU had an early lead after scoring on its first drive of the game capped by an 18-yard pass from Russel Hill to Jaron Taylor for a 7-3 lead. NAU held the Bengals to just five points the rest of the game allowing just a field goal and a fourth-quarter safety in the final minute.
