### A BRIEF PREVIEW

After three weeks of training camp, the Sacramento State football team will open the 2010 season at Stanford on Saturday, Sept. 4. The game will kick off at 3:30 p.m. from Stanford Stadium.

There will be multiple ways to follow this week's game. Hornet fans can tune in to KRJY 1240 AM to hear the radio call of Jason Ross, Steve McElroy and Danny Sullivan. Live audio streaming is also available via www.hornetsports.com. The broadcast will begin at 3 p.m.

The contest will also be carried on Comcast SportsNet Bay Area. Barry Tompkins will handle the play-by-play and will be joined by Mike McLaughlin (color) and Christine Nubla (sideline).

The Hornets enter the season having won three of their final four games in 2009. Included in that run was a thrilling 31-28 victory over UC Davis in the annual Causeway Classic. Against the Aggies, Sacramento State scored 28 second-half points, including a touchdown pass from McLeod Bethel-Thompson to Brandyn Reed with 20 seconds remaining to secure the victory.

Stanford continued its turnaround under head coach Jim Harbaugh by posting an 8-5 overall record and playing in the Brut Sun Bowl against Oklahoma. The Cardinal return quarterback Andrew Luck but will have to find a replacement for the All-American running back Toby Gerhart.

### THE COACHES

Saturday's game pits two former quarterbacks and coaches kids against one another. Sacramento State is led by Marshall Sperbeck who enters his fourth year at the helm. Sperbeck played collegiately at Oregon State and Nevada. His father, Dick, was a longtime high school coach in the Sacramento area and his brother-in-law, Ken O'Brien, played in the NFL for the New York Jets. Prior to taking the Sacramento State job, Sperbeck was the head coach at Foothill College in Los Altos, Calif. (just 5.6 miles from Stanford).

Harbaugh is also preparing for his fourth season at Stanford. The former signal caller at Michigan also played in the NFL for the Chicago Bears, Indianapolis Colts, Baltimore Ravens and San Diego Chargers. His father, Jack, coached at the collegiate level from 1967-2006. Harbaugh's brother, John, is the head coach of the Baltimore Ravens.

### THE SERIES

Despite being separated by just 120 miles, this weekend's contest marks the first football meeting all-time between the two schools. In fact, football is the only sport of the 20 offered at Sacramento State in which the two schools have never competed.

### QUICK HITTERS

- The Hornets have had five different players rush for over 100 yards since the start of the 2008 season.
- Brandyn Reed has caught a touchdown pass in four consecutive games.
- QB McLeod Bethel-Thompson will start the season opening game for the first time in his career.
- Sacramento State has played at least one Football Bowl Subdivision team each year since 2002.
- Saturday's game will be the only one played by the Hornets on natural grass this season. The team will play its five home contests on the newly installed FieldTurf. The other road games at Montana, Eastern Washington, Northern Arizona, Idaho State and UC Davis all feature some form of synthetic surface.

Sacramento State is led by fourth-year head coach Marshall Sperbeck. He is 14-20 in his time with the Hornets. Stanford is guided by Jim Harbaugh. Now in his fourth year with the Cardinal, Harbaugh has posted a 17-20 overall mark at Stanford.

## MARSHALL SPERBECK BIO

Marshall Sperbeck is in his fourth year as the Sacramento State head coach. Sperbeck was hired to lead the Hornets on Jan. 13, 2007 and became the ninth head coach in school history.

No coach in school history has won more games overall or in conference in their first three seasons than Sperbeck. His overall and conference winning percentages also rank him second in program history through three seasons, trailing only Ray Clemons.

Sperbeck's transformation of the program began to show in 2008 when the team posted the second most victories in the school's Div. I-AA/FCS era. Sacramento State also set team records on both sides of the ball and had three players named first team all-Big Sky.

The offense was sparked by Tony Washington who set a school record with 83 receptions and was named third team All-America. In all, 12 Sacramento State players earned all-conference accolades.

In 2009, Sperbeck had 10 members of his team earn all-Big Sky honors, raising his total of 35 during his career. Among those honored were defensive tackle Christian Clark who was named second team All-America by *The Sports Network*.

Off the field, Sacramento State has also had great success. In the 2009-10 school year, the football program posted its highest team grade point average in school history. Sperbeck has also seen numerous players earn their bachelor's degree in his tenure, including all 17 seniors from a year ago.

Prior to coming to Sacramento State, Sperbeck was the head football coach at Foothill College for 15 years. During that time, he produced a 109-53 overall record and led the Owls to 11 bowl games.

A native of Sacramento, Sperbeck graduated from Valley High School. He later played at Nevada from 1981-82 and led the team to a pair of winning seasons while throwing for 3,425 yards.

Sperbeck earned a bachelor's of science degree in physical education from Nevada in 1984 and later added a master's of education in 1989.

## THE LAST TIME OUT

McLeod Bethel-Thompson found Brandyn Reed in the back of the end zone with 20 seconds remaining for his second touchdown reception of the game and lift Sacramento State to a 31-28 victory over UC Davis in the 56th annual Pepsi Causeway Classic in front of 17,127 fans at Hornet Stadium.

Trailing 28-17 early in the fourth quarter, Sacramento State began its comeback with a 10-play, 56-yard drive which was capped by a 2-yard run from Jake Croxdale with 7:36 to play. The Hornets opted to go for two but the conversion failed leaving the score at 28-23.

Sacramento State stopped UC Davis on its next drive when Greg Denham's pass to Chris Carter on the sideline was ruled incomplete on 3rd-and-9. A punt drove the Hornets back to their own 11-yard line with 4:45 remaining. Bethel-Thompson's first two attempts fell incomplete before he connected with John Hendershott for a 13-yard gain to move the ball to the 30. Short passes to Croxdale and Dylan Lane pushed the ball near midfield but an incompletion and another short gain set up 3rd-and-2 where Bethel-Thompson hit Lane for a 6-yard gain to keep the drive alive.

Two more short gains took the ball to the Davis 28 and Bethel-Thompson rushed for 5 yards on 3rd-and-2 to place the place at the 23. Following an incompletion, he found Ron Richardson for a 6-yard gain on second down and again for 4 yards on third down. After a timeout, he lofted the ball to the back right corner of the end zone where Reed was able to run it down for the game-winning touchdown. A two-point pass to Jon Krebs pushed the team to a three-point lead.

Sacramento State sealed the game when Kevin Moore recovered an attempted lateral with four seconds to play.

Bethel-Thompson completed 19-of-29 passes for 233 yards and two touchdowns in his two quarters of work. Reed led all players with seven receptions for 134 yards while Hendershott and Lane each had six catches for 73 and 43 yards, respectively.

## BUSY SUMMER FOR CLARK

• Senior defensive tackle Christian Clark added to his resume over the summer after earning numerous preseason honors.

The Los Angeles native is one of 20 players on the Buck Buchanan Award watch list. The award, which is presented by The Sports Network and Fathead, is given to the best defensive player in the FCS.

Clark also earned first team preseason All-America honors from The Sports Network and Phil Steele's Football Preview, as well as first team preseason all-Big Sky honors.

• Last year, Clark led the team with 15.5 tackles-for-loss and 10.0 sacks. He was a second team All-American and all-Big Sky selection.

• Clark enters the 2010 season tied for fifth in school history with 16.0 career sacks and is sixth with 25.5 career TFLs. Mike Brannon holds both career marks with 27.5 sacks and 25.5 TFLs.

## FOUR NAMED PRESEASON ALL-BSC

• Clark was one of four players named to the preseason all-Big Sky Conference team. The team, which was compiled on a vote by the league's media and media relations directors, was comprised of 12 players on offense and defense and three specialists.

The other Hornets to earn the honor were senior wide receiver Brandyn Reed, senior safety Zach Schrader and junior punter Augie Heath.

## MBT TAKES OVER AT QB

• For the first time in his three years at Sacramento State, McLeod Bethel-Thompson enters the season as the Hornets' starting quarterback.

• Bethel-Thompson came to Sacramento State after spending two years at UCLA. After redshirting in 2006, he started five games for the Bruins in 2007, including the Las Vegas Bowl against BYU.

• The San Francisco native (Balboa High School) saw his first collegiate action against Stanford at Stanford Stadium when he came on in the fourth quarter. UCLA won the game, 45-17.

• Last season, Bethel-Thompson played in six games, starting two, while sharing time with Jason Smith. His biggest performance came in the season finale where he rallied the Hornets for a 31-28 win over UC Davis. After coming in to start the second half, Bethel-Thompson

completed 19-of-29 passes for 223 yards and a pair of touchdowns. He also rushed for a score and helped the team overcome 14-3 deficit.

## NUMBERS GAME

• Sacramento State went through the three weeks of camp with five quarterbacks but ended the practice with only Bethel-Thompson and two freshmen ready to play.

• For the Stanford game, true freshman Garrett Safron will be the backup to Bethel-Thompson. Safron prepped at Santa Monica HS where he earned all-Ocean League honors as a senior. That year, he threw for 2,065 yards and 17 touchdowns.

• Redshirt freshman Dominic Carmazzi is the only other available quarterback on the roster. Carmazzi originally came to the Hornets in the fall of 2008 but greyshirted that year. He then spent the 2009 season as a redshirt. The Sacramento native is the younger brother of former San Francisco 49er Gio Carmazzi.

• Junior college transfer Pete Murdaca was slated to be the backup after spring ball. However, Murdaca injured his shoulder on the first day of fall camp and has not been able to practice since.

• The final member of the corps is Tommy Edwards. The sophomore will have to redshirt in 2010 after transferring from The Citadel. As a true freshman, he played in four games, completing 56-of-97 passes for 588 yards and three touchdowns.

## THE RETURN OF THE 3-4

• The Hornets are not changing their base defense but will be aided by the comeback of running back Bryan Hilliard (No. 34). The junior missed all of 2009 after having surgery on both shoulders.

• Hilliard led the team in rushing in 2007 (826 yards) and 2008 (1,082). He currently ranks sixth in school history with 1,908 yards and is just 16 yards shy of fifth place. The Sacramento native is also fifth in program history with 19 career touchdowns.

• The return of Hilliard adds to an already deep backfield. Junior Jake Croxdale and sophomore Sam McCowan both return after receiving the majority of the workload a season ago.

• Junior Curtis Shaw will also fight for time after transferring from Washington. The speedy back owned the third-fastest 100m time in California as a senior at Lincoln HS in Stockton, Calif.

## JOIN THE CLUB

• Since the start of 2008, five Hornets have rushed for over 100 yards in a single game. In 2008, Hilliard, Evander Wilkins and Croxdale each had at least one game over the century mark. Terrance Dailey had posted three games in 2009 before McCowan rushed for 130 yards against NAU and Croxdale recorded 107 yards at UNC.

• Hilliard leads the group with eight career 100-yard games. Dailey is second with three, and is followed by Wilkins (two) and Croxdale (two) and McCowan (one).  
 • The Hornets' five 100-yard rushers during the two-year span ranked second in the FCS, trailing only Appalachian State's seven.

## PLENTY OF OPTIONS

• Helping Bethel-Thompson will be a stable of receivers who caught 194 of the 201 completed passes. The group is comprised of seven returners and a redshirt freshman who will all try to see time in the team's three-receiver attack.

• Brandyn Reed led the team with 46 receptions, 731 yards and seven touchdowns.

Over the final four games of the year, Reed compiled 338 yards and five touchdowns.

• Dylan Lane earned honorable mention all-Big Sky honors for the first time in his career. The Rocklin, Calif., native caught 40 passes for 409 yards and three touchdowns to set career highs in each category.

• John Hendershott led the Big Sky with an average of 26.1 yards per kick return. He also had a pair of 100-yard receiving games during his first season with the team.

• Chase Deadder returns after missing all of last year with a broken clavicle. In 2008, Deadder caught 21 passes for 358 yards and a TD.

• Brett Willis showed a knack for the end zone in 2009, scoring three touchdowns on eight receptions. The senior will switch to number 14 in 2010 after wearing 88 the past two seasons.

• Ron Richardson was the only player to return a punt a year ago. He also doubled his career total with 19 receptions for 187 yards.

• New to the rotation this year will be redshirt freshman Morris Norrise. The Berkeley HS graduate was the Hornets' offensive scout team player of the year in 2009.

## SECONDARY STABILITY

• With three returning starters from a year ago, the secondary has just one open starting job heading into the year. Safeties Zach Schrader and Deionte Gordon started all 11 games while Marquese Smith earned the job for the final nine games on the corner.

• Schrader became the first Hornet to earn the Big Sky Newcomer of the Year award. He was also a second team all-Big Sky selection and was voted to the league's preseason team.

• Schrader led the team with 103 total tackles and four interceptions in his first season at Sacramento State. He came to the Hornets when Div. II Western Washington discontinued its program.

• Gordon battled through a nagging shoulder injury all season to record 80 total tackles. The Seaside, Calif., native enters the year tied for 20th in school history with 156 career stops.

• Smith has started games in both of his previous seasons. Last year, he returned an interception against Idaho State 83 yards for a touchdown.

• Junior college transfer Kyle Monson is slated to earn the start opposite of Smith at the other cornerback position. Monson spent 2009 at Grossmont College where he was a JC All-American. He began his collegiate career at Arizona (2007-08).

• Wilkins made his defensive debut during the spring and will be the team's top nickelback. The Sacramento native has seen time at running back during the past three seasons where he has amassed 589 career yards. After suffering separate knee injuries the last two years, Wilkins was granted another season of eligibility by the NCAA.

## O-LINE SHUFFLE

• For the first time in his career, John Taylor will not be the starting center for Sacramento State. After starting the last 23 games in the middle of the line, Taylor will move to left tackle for the 2010 season.

• Taylor's move was made possible with the arrival of Jaren Harrell in the spring. The Quartz Hill, Calif., native transferred to Sacramento State for the spring semester after Hofstra discontinued its football team. The 6-foot-3, 285-pounder had been a two-year starter for the Pride.

• The only other returning starter on the offensive line is Nate Doverspike. The junior continues to develop,

entering the season at 6-5, 275. Doverspike began his career as a tight end before moving to tackle last year where he started all 11 games.

- Junior Maika Maumau and redshirt freshman Tyler Worthley will earn the starts at guard. Maumau had played defensive tackle for two years before switching sides of the ball in the spring.

## BRINGING THE BOOM

- Senior kicker Chris Diniz set numerous Sacramento State records during his first season (2009). The Escalon, Calif., native began his college career by making his first 10 field goal attempts before finally missing on his second attempt at Northern Colorado.

While his 10 consecutive makes easily broke the previous school record of six, the one thing Diniz did not have was a long attempt. With the exception of his first field goal of the year — a 44-yarder at UNLV — Diniz had not attempted a kick longer than 41 yards. That all changed on when he made a 52-yarder at Montana State which tied him for second in school history.

- Diniz, who redshirted last season, finished the season making 12-of-13 field goals as well as 32-of-34 extra points for a team leading 66 points. His .923 accuracy on field goals set the school single-season record and led the Big Sky.

## COACHING FAST FACTS

- There have been nine coaches in the history of Sacramento State football and none have more wins in their first three years than Marshall Sperbeck. The second-year coach went 14-20 in his first 24 games and also holds the record with 10 Big Sky victories in that span.

- Second-year assistant Anthony Parker takes over as defensive coordinator in 2010. Parker served as the team's defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator during his first season. Prior to working with the Hornets, Parker was a member of the Boise State staff.

- Other changes in 2010 include Klayton Adams moving from tight ends/tackles to offensive line coach, Robby Case shifting from offensive assistant to tight ends, and Daniel DaPrato adding the role of special teams coordinator.

- New to the staff are offensive assistant Adam Herald and defensive assistant Greg Sasser.

## KEEP MOVING FORWARD

- Sacramento State joined the many schools to play on a synthetic surface during the summer of 2010. Installed by FieldTurf, the process took just over three months and allows the stadium to host events throughout the year.

- Other new additions around the stadium include The Well, a student recreation and health center, which opens in early September. The 151,000 square foot facility encloses the north end of the stadium.

- In 2008, Sacramento State opened the Eli & Edythe Broad Fieldhouse which is home to Hornet football and track and field as well as a weight room and athletic training room.

## JUST THE FACTS

- The Big Sky Conference will continue to provide free video streaming of football games this year. Any game hosted by a Big Sky school can be seen after registering with B2 Network.

- Thanks to some fine research from the *Bozeman Chronicle's* Will Holden, Hornet defensive coordinator Lou Baiz has been confirmed as the longest tenured coach in the Big Sky. Baiz is currently in his 17th year on the staff.
