A BRIEF PREVIEW

The Sacramento State football team will look to bounce back from consecutive three-point losses when it welcomes Northern Colorado to Hornet Stadium on Saturday, Oct. 9. The game will kick off at 2:05 p.m. and is designated as the University's Homecoming.

Sacramento State comes into the week with a 2-3 overall record and a 1-2 mark in Big Sky Conference games. The Hornets are still receiving votes in The Sports Network/Fathead Top 25 but have dropped out of the FCS Coaches Poll.

The Hornets' latest heartbreaker came against No. 10 Montana State. Sacramento State trailed 37-10 at the half only to respond with 35 points in the third quarter to take a 45-44 lead into the fourth quarter. From that point, the teams traded scores and were deadlocked 61-61 at the end of regulation. Jason Cunningham's 25-yard field proved to be the difference as Sacramento State's game-tying attempt missed wide left.

Northern Colorado also owns a 2-3 overall record and is 1-2 in league play. The Bears have wins over Adams State and Idaho State with losses against Weber State, Michigan State and Montana.

Andre Harris, who rushed for two touchdowns in last season's meeting, leads the team with 74.0 rushing yards per game. The UNC offense is led by quarterback Dylan Orms who has completed 55-of-111 passes for six touchdowns and six interceptions.

There will be multiple ways to follow this week's game. Hornet fans can tune in to KRJY 1240 AM to hear the radio call of Jason Ross, Steve McElroy and Danny Sullivan. Live audio streaming is also available via www.hornetsports.com. The broadcast will begin at 1:30 p.m.

Live video streaming will also return via BigSkyTV.org. To access to the free broadcast, you must register through BigSkyTV.org prior to kickoff.

THE COACHES

Marshall Sperbeck is in his fourth season as the head coach at Sacramento State. During that span, Sperbeck has produced a 16-23 overall record. The Sacramento native also serves as the team's offensive coordinator. For a complete bio, please see page 2.

Northern Colorado is coached by Scott Downing. Also in his fourth year, Downing is 8-41 with the Bears. Downing has been an assistant at Purdue, Wyoming and Nebraska and was also the head coach at Sterling College for two years.

THE SERIES

Sacramento State leads the all-time series, 4-0, and is 2-0 in games played at Hornet Stadium. Last season's game was a wild affair as the Hornets built a 31-0 halftime lead and then held on for a 38-35 victory. Jake Croxdale led Sacramento State with 107 rushing yards and two touchdowns.

QUICK HITTERS

- Bryan Hilliard has rushed for four consecutive 100-yard games.
- The Hornets have now played two games which have been decided by a 64-61 score.
- Sacramento State defeated Weber State for the first time under Sperbeck.
- The game at Stanford was the only one played on natural grass this season.

MARSHALL SPERBECK BIO

Marshall Sperbeck is in his fourth year as the Sacramento State head coach. Sperbeck was hired to lead the Hornets on Jan. 13, 2007 and became the ninth head coach in school history.

No coach in school history has won more games overall or in conference in their first three seasons than Sperbeck. His overall and conference winning percentages also rank him second in program history through three seasons, trailing only Ray Clemons.

Sperbeck's transformation of the program began to show in 2008 when the team posted the second most victories in the school's Div. I-AA/FCS era. Sacramento State also set team records on both sides of the ball and had three players named first team all-Big Sky.

The offense was sparked by Tony Washington who set a school record with 83 receptions and was named third team All-America. In all, 12 Sacramento State players earned all-conference accolades.

In 2009, Sperbeck had 10 members of his team earn all-Big Sky honors, raising his total of 35 during his career. Among those honored were defensive tackle Christian Clark who was named second team All-America by The Sports Network.

Off the field, Sacramento State has also had great success. In the 2009-10 school year, the football program posted its highest team grade point average in school history. Sperbeck has also seen numerous players earn their bachelor's degree in his tenure, including all 17 seniors from a year ago.

Prior to coming to Sacramento State, Sperbeck was the head football coach at Foothill College for 15 years. During that time, he produced a 109-53 overall record and led the Owls to 11 bowl games.

A native of Sacramento, Sperbeck graduated from Valley High School. He later played at Nevada from 1981-82 and led the team to a pair of winning seasons while throwing for 3,425 yards.

Sperbeck earned a bachelor's of science degree in physical education from Nevada in 1984 and later added a master's of education in 1989.

THE LAST TIME OUT

Jason Cunningham's 25-yard field in the first period of overtime proved to be the difference as No. 10 Montana State held on for a wild 64-61 victory over Sacramento State at Hornet Stadium.

The Bobcats improved to 4-1 overall and 2-0 in Big Sky play but were forced to rally for the victory after leading 37-10 at halftime.

Sacramento State (2-3, 1-2) stormed back in the second half, scoring five touchdowns in the third quarter to take a 45-44 lead. Helping the charge was quarterback Jeff Fleming who completed 10-of-12 passes for 207 yards and three touchdowns and ran for another. Fleming's top target in the quarter was redshirt freshman Morris Norisse, who hauled in all three TDs for his only grabs of the game.

The fourth quarter saw the teams exchange the lead four times before Montana State tied the contest at 61-61 when Denarius McGhee connected with Julius Lloyd for an 8-yard touchdown with 1:17 remaining.

In overtime, Sacramento State was able to keep the Bobcats out of the end zone and forced Cunningham to kick a 25-yard field goal.

The Hornets answered back with three pass plays but were unable to move the ball. Senior Chris Diniz then came on to tie the game but his 43-yard attempt missed to the left by inches ending the game.

The game produced amazing offensive numbers. The two teams combined for 1,260 yards of total offense (MSU 646, SAC 624) on 160 plays. There were also 10 plays — five for both teams — that resulted in gains of at least 25 yards.

Individually, Fleming threw for 348 yards and five touchdowns. Bryan Hilliard rushed for 194 yards and two touchdowns and Chase Deadder caught six passes for a career-high 145 yards and a score.

Montana State was led by McGhee who was 26-of-43 for 385 yards and four touchdowns. Running back C.J. Palmer rushed for 131 yards and two touchdowns on just 12 carries and Lloyd caught eight passes for 177 yards and three TDs.

AFTER FURTHER REVIEW

- Sacramento State's 61 points were tied for the third most in program history.
- The point total is the most for the Hornets in a loss. The previous high was 49 set twice in 1999.
- The 35 points scored in the third quarter set a program record for points in any quarter. The previous high was 27 in the second quarter against Azusa Pacific on Oct. 8, 2005.
- The 35 points also tied the NCAA FCS record for points in the third quarter. Sacramento State now shares the record with Portland State (vs. Delaware State, 1980) and Louisiana Monroe (vs. Arkansas State, 1993).
- The 64 points allowed are the second most in school history. The Hornets surrendered 75 to Nevada in 1977.
- Montana State set the record for most points scored at Hornet Stadium by an opponent.
- The 125 combined points tied the school record and is tied for the second most in FCS history. The Hornets defeated Cal State Northridge, 64-61, on Nov. 4, 2000.
- Sacramento State's 624 yards of total offense is the second most in school history. The school record is 641 against Idaho State on Sept. 27, 2003.
- The Hornets' average of 8.10 yards per play is the third highest in school history.
- Sacramento State's eight touchdowns are tied for the second best total in school history. The team scored nine against Saint Mary's on Sept. 6, 2003.
- For the first time in the school's FCS era, both teams had a 300-yard passer, a 100-yard rusher and a 100-yard receiver.
- Jeff Fleming tied the school record by accounting for six touchdowns. Fleming threw for five and rushed for one.
- His five passing touchdowns are the second most in school history. Ryan Leadingham holds the school mark with six against Idaho State on Sept. 27, 2003.
- Fleming's 348 passing yards is tied for the 14th most at Sacramento State and were the most since Jason Smith threw for 396 against Eastern Washington in 2007.
- Bryan Hilliard's 194 rushing yards were the 24th most in school history and gave him 12 100-yard games for his career.
- Morris Norisse became only the second Hornet to catch three touchdown passes in the same quarter. Norisse joins Chris Kelly who had four total touchdowns (three in the fourth quarter) at Montana in 2000.

THIRD QUARTER SUMMARY

- Sacramento State's comeback in the third quarter likely will never be duplicated. The team scored 35 points in the quarter, including three touchdowns in the first 6:14 of the period.
- The Hornets took the opening drive and marched 80 yards on a drive which was capped by a 1-yard Hilliard touchdown with 12:49 showing on the clock.
- Chris Diniz followed with an onside kick which was recovered by Chase Deadder to give the ball back to Sacramento State. Six plays later, Fleming snuck in from the 1 with 11:25 left to a play.
- After holding Montana State to a 3-and-out, Fleming hit Norisse for a 26-yard touchdown with 8:46 left.
- Another 3-and-out was followed by a 30-yard pass from Fleming to Norisse to give the Hornets a 38-37 lead with 6:09 remaining in the third.
- MSU retook the lead with a 2-yard from C.J. Palmer only to have Norisse catch a 20-yard touchdown from Fleming with 2:29 remaining.

- Individually, Fleming completed 10-of-12 passes for 207 yards and three touchdowns. Chase Deadder caught four passes for 91 yards and Norisse had three receptions for 76 yards and three touchdowns.

THE CHASE IS ON

- Junior Chase Deadder enjoyed his biggest day as a Hornet, catching six passes for 145 yards and a touchdown. Prior to the game, Deadder's career highs were five catches for 86 yards at UC Davis in 2008.
- Along with his career day receiving, Deadder also sparked the Hornet rally by catching Chris Diniz's onside kick along the sideline.
- Deadder now leads the team with 18 receptions for 362 yards. His two TDs also ties him for second.
- The Modesto, Calif., native missed all of last season after suffering a broken clavicle which required several surgeries.

KEEPING IT GOING

• Bryan Hilliard recorded his fourth 100-yard game in as many weeks with a season high 194 rushing yards against Montana State. The junior gained 74 yards in the first half and tacked on 120 more yards over the next two periods.

• Hilliard is currently averaging 117.8 yards per game which ranks second in the Big Sky this season and eighth in the Football Championship Subdivision. He also ranks 12th among active running backs in the FCS with 2,497 career rushing yards.

• Sacramento State senior linebacker Peter Buck was named a semifinalist for the 2010 William V. Campbell Trophy. Buck is one of 121 semifinalists for the award which is presented by the National Football Foundation and endowed by HealthSouth.

• Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The trophy was renamed last fall in honor of Bill Campbell, the chairman of Intuit, former player and head coach at Columbia University and the 2004 recipient of the NFF's Gold Medal.

WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

- Jeff Fleming took over the starting role from McLeod Bethel-Thompson after the senior was injured against Stanford.
- Fleming first starred at Fullerton College in 2008, leading the Hornets (yes, the same mascot as Sacramento State), to a conference title and eventually to the state semifinals. He then transferred to New Mexico State where he started nine games and played in all 13 a year ago.
- After being asked to move to wide receiver and serve as the Aggies' wildcat quarterback late in fall camp, Fleming opted to transfer to Sacramento State. He arrived on campus on Sunday, Aug. 29, and began practicing with the team a day later. After going through the Big Sky's three-day acclimatization and enrolling in 12-units, he was finally cleared to play late Thursday night (Sept. 3). Thirty-six hours later, he was on the field in relief of the injured Bethel-Thompson.
- For this week, true freshman Garrett Safron will serve as the team's backup signal caller. Redshirt freshman Dominic Carmazzi is also available for action.

COACHING FAST FACTS

- There have been nine coaches in the history of Sacramento State football and none have more wins in their first three years than Marshall Sperbeck. The fourth-year coach went 14-20 in his first 34 games and also holds the record with 10 Big Sky victories in that span.
- Second-year assistant Anthony Parker takes over as defensive coordinator in 2010. Parker served as the team's defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator during his first season. Prior to working with the Hornets, Parker was a member of the Boise State staff.
- Other changes in 2010 include Klayton Adams moving from tight ends/tackles to offensive line coach, Robby Case shifting from offensive assistant to tight ends, and Daniel DaPrato adding the role of special teams coordinator.
- New to the staff are offensive assistant Adam Herald and defensive assistant Greg Sasser.
- Thanks to some fine research from the Bozeman Chronicle's Will Holden, Hornet linebacker coach Lou Baiz has been confirmed as the longest tenured coach in the Big Sky. Baiz is currently in his 17th year on the staff.
