### A BRIEF PREVIEW

The Sacramento State football team will look to shake off another heart-wrenching loss, when it travels to Flagstaff, Ariz., to take on 25th-ranked Northern Arizona on Saturday, Oct. 30, at 3:05 p.m. The game marks the fifth time that the Hornets will face a team ranked in The Sports Network/Fathead.com Top 25 in the last six games.

Most recently, Sacramento State (3-4 overall, 2-3 Big Sky Conference) lost at then-No. 8 Eastern Washington, 28-24 on Saturday in Cheney, Wash. The Hornets fell behind 21-0 in the first half and trailed 21-3 entering the fourth quarter before a furious comeback gave the team a 24-21 lead with 7:22 remaining. However, Eastern Washington halted the Hornets' comeback attempt when Bo Levi Mitchell connected with Brandon Kaufman for a 6-yard touchdown with 33 seconds remaining. The loss was just the latest in a series of close encounters for Sacramento State as the team's three conference defeats have come by a combined total of 10 points.

Northern Arizona can sympathize with the Hornets' plight as the Lumberjacks became the latest victim of a Montana comeback, losing 24-21 in Missoula, Mont., as UM scored a touchdown with five seconds left in the game. NAU is now 4-3 overall and 2-2 in Big Sky games.

Defense has been one of the key strengths for the Lumberjacks this season as the squad enters this week ranked third in the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision against the rush, fourth in total defense and 11th in points allowed per game.

There will be multiple ways to follow this week's game. Hornet fans can tune in to KRJY 1240 AM to hear the radio call of Steve McElroy and Brian Berger. Live audio streaming is also available via www.hornetsports.com. The broadcast will begin at 2:30 p.m.

Live video streaming will also return via BigSkyTV.org. To access to the free broadcast, you must register through BigSkyTV.org prior to kickoff.

### THE COACHES

Marshall Sperbeck is in his fourth season as the head coach at Sacramento State. During that span, Sperbeck has produced a 17-24 overall record. The Sacramento native also serves as the team's offensive coordinator. For a complete bio, please see page 2.

Northern Arizona is coached by Jerome Souers who is in his 13th season with the team. During his tenure, Souers has guided the Lumberjacks to a 70-73 overall record.

### THE SERIES

Northern Arizona leads the all-time series, 9-6. The two teams have exchanged victories the last five years with the home team winning each contest. Sacramento State is 3-5 all-time in Flagstaff, Ariz.

### QUICK HITTERS

- Bryan Hilliard has rushed for a career-best six consecutive 100-yard games.
- The Hornets' three conference losses have come by a combined total of 10 points.
- Sacramento State defeated Weber State for the first time under Sperbeck.
- The game at Stanford was the only one played on natural grass this season.

Sacramento State is 3-4 overall following a last-minute loss to then-No. 8 Eastern Washington. Northern Arizona also suffered a heartbreaker, falling at Montana, 24-21, with five seconds left to drop to 4-3.

#### Rankings

Sacramento State is receiving votes in The Sports Network Poll but not the FCS Coaches Poll. Northern Arizona is ranked 25th in the TSN poll and not ranked in the coaches poll.

#### The Series

Northern Arizona leads the all-time series 9-6. The home team has won each of the last five years.

#### The Coaches

Sacramento State is led by fourth-year head coach Marshall Sperbeck. He is 17-24 in his time with the Hornets. Northern Arizona is guided by Jerome Souers who is also in his 13th season at NAU, making him the longest tenured head coach in the Big Sky.

## MARSHALL SPERBECK BIO

Marshall Sperbeck is in his fourth year as the Sacramento State head coach. Sperbeck was hired to lead the Hornets on Jan. 13, 2007 and became the ninth head coach in school history.

No coach in school history has won more games overall or in conference in their first three seasons than Sperbeck. His overall and conference winning percentages also rank him second in program history through three seasons, trailing only Ray Clemons.

Sperbeck's transformation of the program began to show in 2008 when the team posted the second most victories in the school's Div. I-AA/FCS era. Sacramento State also set team records on both sides of the ball and had three players named first team all-Big Sky.

The offense was sparked by Tony Washington who set a school record with 83 receptions and was named third team All-America. In all, 12 Sacramento State players earned all-conference accolades.

In 2009, Sperbeck had 10 members of his team earn all-Big Sky honors, raising his total of 35 during his career. Among those honored were defensive tackle Christian Clark who was named second team All-America by The Sports Network.

Off the field, Sacramento State has also had great success. In the 2009-10 school year, the football program posted its highest team grade point average in school history. Sperbeck has also seen numerous players earn their bachelor's degree in his tenure, including all 17 seniors from a year ago.

Prior to coming to Sacramento State, Sperbeck was the head football coach at Foothill College for 15 years. During that time, he produced a 109-53 overall record and led the Owls to 11 bowl games.

A native of Sacramento, Sperbeck graduated from Valley High School. He later played at Nevada from 1981-82 and led the team to a pair of winning seasons while throwing for 3,425 yards.

Sperbeck earned a bachelor's of science degree in physical education from Nevada in 1984 and later added a master's of education in 1989.

## THE LAST TIME OUT

Brandon Kaufman hauled in a 6-yard pass with 33 seconds remaining to lift No. 8 Eastern Washington to a 28-24 win over Sacramento State at Roos Field.

The Hornets rallied from a 21-3 deficit heading into the fourth quarter to take a 24-21 lead with 7:22 remaining in the game. The team scored its first touchdown of the game on a 3-yard run from Bryan Hilliard early in the period.

After another second-half stop by the defense, Zach Schrader blocked a punt which was scooped up by Henry Fernandez at the 23-yard line and returned for a touchdown. Sacramento State took its first lead of the game just four minutes later when Hilliard scored from 1-yard out.

After the score, the Hornet defense responded by stopping EWU and forcing a punt. However, Sacramento State was not able to move the chains and punted the ball back to Eastern Washington with 3:18 to play.

The Eagles converted a 3rd-and-12 pass and scored three plays later on a lob from Bo Levi Mitchell to Kaufman in the right side of the end zone.

EWU jumped to a 21-0 lead midway through the first quarter. Kaufman caught a 17-yard pass on nearly the same play as the game-winner for the only points of the first quarter.

Early in the second, Taiwan Jones pinballed his way through the Sacramento State defense for a 77-yard touchdown run. Ashton Grant added a 25-yard TD with 9:35 to play in the half.

Sacramento State's lone points of the half came on a 28-yard field goal from Chris Diniz with seven seconds remaining.

Hilliard rushed for 107 yards and two scores on his 30 carries. The junior has now rushed for over 100 yards in eight of his last nine games. Chase Deadder caught three passes for 124 yards, including a 76-yarder to lead the team.

Defensively, Peter Buck tallied nine tackles to lead the team.

## BLOCK PARTY

- Sacramento State continued its streak of getting to the opposing punter, blocking two punts at Eastern Washington. The Hornets have now blocked three punts in the last two games and have deflected two others over the last three contests.
- Against Eastern Washington, freshman Randey Peterson picked up his first block of the season on the opening drive of the third quarter.
- Peterson was on the other end of the punt block in the previous game against Northern Colorado when he recovered the ball for a 3-yard touchdown following a block by Corey Vanderbeek.
- In the fourth quarter against the Eagles, Sacramento State pulled within four points when Zach Schrader blocked Cameron Zuber's punt and freshman Henry Fernandez outran the Eagle tacklers for a 23-yard touchdown.
- Sacramento State appeared to have another block in the first half when Dana Willis laid out and tipped the ball. However, the officials ruled that Willis did not make contact with the ball, and he was called for roughing the kicker. That penalty kept the drive alive for the Eagles and eventually led to a touchdown.
- Prior to this season, Sacramento State had not returned a blocked punt for a touchdown since Oct. 20, 2001, when Camron Mbewa blocked the kick and returned the ball for a 45-yard score.
- As a team, the Hornets had not blocked two punts in a season since 1999.

## CLOSE ENCOUNTERS

- Saturday's loss was just the latest in a series of close defeats for Sacramento State this season. The Hornets have now dropped three games — all against ranked teams — by a combined total of 10 points.
- All three contests have seen the team take a lead in the fourth quarter.
- Since the start of football at Sacramento State (1954) the 1980 season is the only one in which the team lost four or more games by four points or less. That season, the team was 3-7 overall.
- There have been four other years in which the team suffered three losses within that spread.
- In 2000, the Hornets played six games that were decided by four points or less. That year, the team was 3-3 in those games and finished at 7-4 overall.

## RANK AND FILE

- This week's game at Northern Arizona marks the fifth time in the last six games that Sacramento State has faced a ranked opponent.
- The Hornets have already met four teams that are currently ranked among the top 25 of their respective polls. Sacramento State opened the year at Stanford, which is currently ranked 13th in the AP Top 25. Among FCS teams, Montana is seventh, EWU eighth, and Eastern Washington is 13th.
- Entering this week, Sacramento State has played the seventh-toughest schedule in the FCS, according to the NCAA formula which considers only games against FCS competition. The Hornets' opposition has combined to go 22-14 for a .611 winning percentage.

## MANY HAPPY RETURNS

- Sacramento State has now scored four touchdowns this season on non-offensive plays.
- The first came from Kyle Monson who returned a punt 70 yards at Stanford in the opening game of the season. That return was the first by a Hornet for a touchdown since Fred Amey went 83 yards against Saint Mary's on Sept. 6, 2003.
- Peterson's blocked punt return against Northern Colorado was followed by a 5-yard fumble recovery from David Coleman against the Bears.
- The latest came last week when Fernandez returned the blocked punt at Eastern Washington.

## DOULBE-0 32

- Since taking over for the injured Marquese Smith, Osagie Odiase has made his presence felt in the Hornet defense.
- The redshirt freshman has started the last four games for the team and has recorded 22 of his 27 tackles this season in that span.
- Odiase (pronounced o-DEE-ah-say) has also picked off two passes in the last two games and is now tied for the team lead in interceptions with Evander Wilkins.
- In the victory over Northern Colorado, the Santa Fe Springs, Calif., native recorded his first career interception when he jumped a route in the end zone, helping the team preserve its second-half shutout.
- This past week, Odiase had an interception and recorded his first career sack.

• Bryan Hilliard recorded his sixth 100-yard game in as many weeks with 105 rushing yards and two touchdowns at Eastern Washington on 31 carries. The junior did most of his damage in the third quarter, rushing for 55 yards on 10 carries.

• Hilliard is currently averaging 118.4 yards per game which ranks second in the Big Sky this season and 11th in the Football Championship Subdivision. He also ranks 12th among active running backs in the FCS with 2,737 career rushing yards.

## SECOND HALF STORM

• Sacramento State is making a habit of second-half comebacks. For the third straight week, the Hornets crushed their opponent over the final two quarters, outscoring Eastern Washington 21-7.

• Over the last three games, Sacramento State has scored 100 points in the second half while surrendering only 31.

• The first rally came against Montana State where the Hornets trailed 38-10 at halftime. In the third quarter, the team scored 35 points, including three touchdowns in the first 6:14 of the period.

• In that rally, Jeff Fleming threw three touchdowns to Morris Norrise and rushed for another while Bryan Hilliard added two rushing touchdowns of his own.

• While the offense earned the accolades against the Bobcats, the defense stole the show versus Northern Colorado. As a team, Sacramento State limited UNC to just 64 yards in the second half, including 14 rushing yards.

• The second-half shutout was the second for the Hornets in the last two years. Sacramento State last blanked its opponent in the final two quarters on Oct. 31, 2009 in the victory over Northern Arizona.

• At Eastern Washington, the Hornets did all of their second-half scoring in the fourth quarter, scoring three touchdowns in the first seven minutes of the period. The final score gave the team the lead, but EWU answered with a touchdown with 33 seconds left to account for its only points of the half.

## WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

- Jeff Fleming took over the starting role from McLeod Bethel-Thompson after the senior was injured against Stanford.
- Fleming first starred at Fullerton College in 2008, leading the Hornets (yes, the same mascot as Sacramento State), to a conference title and eventually to the state semifinals. He then transferred to New Mexico State where he started nine games and played in all 13 a year ago.
- After being asked to move to wide receiver and serve as the Aggies' wildcat quarterback late in fall camp, Fleming opted to transfer to Sacramento State. He arrived on campus on Sunday, Aug. 29, and began practicing with the team a day later. After going through the Big Sky's three-day acclimatization and enrolling in 12-units, he was finally cleared to play late Thursday night (Sept. 3). Thirty-six hours later, he was on the field in relief of the injured Bethel-Thompson.
- For this week, true freshman Garrett Safron will serve as the team's backup signal caller. Redshirt freshman Dominic Carmazzi is also available for action.

## COACHING FAST FACTS

- There have been nine coaches in the history of Sacramento State football and none have more wins in their first three years than Marshall Sperbeck. The fourth-year coach went 14-20 in his first 34 games and also holds the record with 10 Big Sky victories in that span.
- Second-year assistant Anthony Parker takes over as defensive coordinator in 2010. Parker served as the team's defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator during his first season. Prior to working with the Hornets, Parker was a member of the Boise State staff.
- Other changes in 2010 include Klayton Adams moving from tight ends/tackles to offensive line coach, Robby Case shifting from offensive assistant to tight ends, and Daniel DaPrato adding the role of special teams coordinator.
