**WAC Highlights**

- The 46th year of WAC football begins this Thursday when New Mexico State hosts Southeastern Louisiana, UNLV is at Utah State and Weber State travels to Boise State. The first conference game is on Sept. 8 when Louisiana Tech hosts Hawai'i.
- Hawai'i was picked by both the WAC media and WAC coaches as the favorite to win the 2007 WAC Championship. Boise State was voted second. Nevada was picked third in the coaches' poll while Fresno State was voted third in the media poll.
- Hawai'i quarterback **Colt Brennan** was voted the preseason Offensive Player of the Year for the second straight season while San Jose State defensive back **Dwight Lowery** was picked as the Defensive Player of the Year. Brennan, a senior, set NCAA records last year with 58 touchdowns passes and an efficiency rating of 186.0. He threw for 5,549 yards with just 12 interceptions in 2006. Lowery, a senior, was a first-team All-America last year after picking off nine passes. He made 48 tackles and racked up 111 interception return yards in helping the Spartan defense rank third in the WAC.

**2007 BOWL LINEUP** – The WAC is affiliated with three bowl games this season. WAC teams will play in the New Mexico Bowl in Albuquerque versus a Mountain West opponent, in the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl in Honolulu against a Conference USA opponent and in the Rody's Humanitarian Bowl in Boise versus a team from the ACC.

**BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES** – Since 1997, the WAC has been an official part of the Bowl Championship Series. The WAC champion will receive an automatic berth in one of the five BCS bowl games if ranked in the top 12 of the BCS Standings or if ranked in the top 16 of the BCS Standings and its ranking is higher than that of a champion of a conference that has an annual automatic berth in one of the BCS bowls. The BCS Standings are determined by a formula involving polls and computer rankings. This year's National Championship Game will be played in New Orleans on Jan. 7, 2008.

### WAC OWNS BEST FIVE-YEAR BOWL WINNING PERCENTAGE

– Over the last five years, the WAC has the best winning percentage in bowl games of any conference in the nation. The WAC has sent 18 teams to postseason games from 2002-06 and those teams won 61.1 percent of those games with an 11-7 record. WAC teams won three of four bowl games in 2006, one of three games in 2005, two of four games in 2004, three of four in 2003 and two of three in 2002. During this five-year span, WAC teams are 6-3 in bowl games against teams from conferences that have an automatic berth into the BCS.

### WAC TOPS NATION IN ALL-TIME BOWL RECORDS

– The WAC's nine teams have an all-time record of 32-24-2 (.569) in bowl games. That winning percentage is the best among the 11 Division IA conferences based on current membership. The ACC is second at .537 followed by the SEC (.521) and Pac-10 (.519).

### BOISE STATE WITH NATION'S LONGEST WINNING STREAK

– Boise State, Fresno State and Hawai'i have combined for 140 victories since the 2002 season. That total is tied for the fifth most of any Division IA conference's top trio.

**TOP STAT LEADERS** – Following are the returning stat leaders in the WAC for 2007. Boise State's **Ian Johnson** returns for his junior season after rushing for 142.8 yards per game, the most in the WAC and second in the nation last year. New Mexico State's **Chris Williams** was first in the nation in both receptions per game (7.7) and receiving yards per game (117.9). He will also be a junior in 2007. Hawai'i's **Colt Brennan** had an NCAA-record pass efficiency rating of 186.0 as a junior last year. He was also first in the nation in total offense with 422.5 yards per game. On the defensive side, San Jose State linebacker **Matt Castelo** was first in the WAC and second in the nation in tackles with 12.7 stops per game as a junior. Nevada's **Ezra Butler** was fourth in sacks with 7.0 as a junior.

**RETURNING ALL-WAC PLAYERS** – Of the 27 first-team all-WAC players in 2006, 10 return for the 2007 season. Boise State, Hawai'i, Idaho and San Jose State each return two players. The Broncos will return junior running back **Ian Johnson** and junior offensive lineman **Ryan Clady**.

Hawai'i returns senior quarterback **Colt Brennan** and junior wide receiver **Davone Bess**. Idaho welcomes back senior linebacker **David Vobora** and senior defensive back **Stanley Franks**. San Jose State brings back senior defensive back **Dwight Lowery** and senior punter **Waylon Prather**. The other two returnees are Nevada senior linebacker **Ezra Butler** and New Mexico State junior wide receiver **Chris Williams**. There were 27 second-team players, and 13 of those should return to action this year. Hawai'i and San Jose State have the most second-team players returning with three each. Boise State and Nevada have two and Fresno State, Louisiana Tech and Utah State return one each.

**TEAMS RACK UP VICTORIES** – Since the 2002 football season, the WAC's top teams have established themselves as some of the most successful programs west of the Mississippi River. Boise State has won 58 games over the last five years while Hawai'i has 43 wins and Fresno State has 39. Only USC (59) has won more than Boise State. There are 53 Division IA programs west of the Mississippi that include all of the teams from the WAC, Big 12, Mountain West and Pac-10 and several teams from the Big Ten, Conference USA, SEC and Sun Belt.

**NEW COACHES** – The WAC welcomes two new head coaches this year. **Derek Dooley** was introduced as Louisiana Tech's 31st head coach on Dec. 17. Dooley, son of former Georgia head coach and athletic director Vince Dooley, comes to Louisiana Tech after serving as an assistant coach for the Miami Dolphins the past two years. **Robb Akey** became Idaho's head football coach on Dec. 20. Akey, 40, made a short trip to Moscow from Pullman, Wash., where he was the defensive coordinator for Washington State University since 2003 and a member of the Cougar defensive staff since 1999.

**BOWL OPPONENTS** – Of the 37 non-conference matchups, 15 are against teams that played in bowl games last year and three are at WAC home sites. Eight teams in the WAC play at least one non-conference opponent that competed in a bowl last year while Fresno State is playing a WAC-high three bowl opponents. Idaho, Louisiana Tech, New Mexico State, San Jose State and Utah State are playing two each while Boise State and Nevada are playing one apiece.

**COACHES MOVING UP RECORD LISTS** – A couple of WAC coaches are working their way up the NCAA coaching record lists. Nevada head coach **Chris Ault** will begin his 23rd season as a head coach and is 185-78-1, the fifth winningest active coach in Division IA. San Jose State's **Dick Tomey** is the eighth winningest active coach as he begins his third year with the Spartans and 27th overall with a record of 170-122-7. Tomey previously won 63 games at Hawai'i from 1977-86 and 95 games at Arizona from 1987-2000. Tomey has coached 299 games, the fourth most among active coaches. In WAC games only, Fresno State head coach **Pat Hill** has 54 conference victories, the fourth most in league history while Tomey enters the 2007 season with 40 WAC wins, the seventh most.

**INSTANT REPLAY** – For the second year in a row the WAC will have instant replay as per NCAA rules after experimenting with it during the 2005 season.

**BRONCOS WIN TWO ESPYS** – Boise State was two-for-two at the 2007 ESPY Awards last July. Boise State claimed each of the two awards it was nominated for, including "Best Game of the Year" and "Best Play of the Year." The Broncos won the award for the best game with its 43-42 overtime win over Oklahoma in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl. The Broncos' winning two-point conversion on a Statue of Liberty play in overtime claimed the honor for best play.

### (24/23) Boise State Broncos (0-0, 0-0 WAC)

Has the nation's longest winning streak at 13 in a row ... has won 36 consecutive regular season home games ... won its fifth consecutive WAC title last year ... is the first WAC team to accomplish that feat since BYU won five in a row from 1989-93 ... its current title streak matches USC for the longest current streak in the nation ... RB Ian Johnson had 25 rushing TDs last year, one shy of the WAC record ... is the top scoring team in the nation since 2000 with 41.7 points per game ... is 45-3 all-time in WAC games ... has won 51 of its last 53 home games and 30 straight conference games at home ... has never lost a WAC home game (24-0) ... is 86-16 (.843) since 1999, the best record of any team in the nation.



### Nevada Wolf Pack (0-0, 0-0 WAC)

Has played in consecutive bowl games for the first time since the 1995-96 seasons ... is 17-8 over the last two seasons, its best mark since going 18-6 from 1995-96 ... has won 10 of its last 11 home games ... is 15-3 in home games since the return of head coach Chris Ault ... the Pack has not been shut out in 317 games (Sept. 27, 1980), the longest active streak in the country ... Nevada has had at least one 1,000-yard rusher or receiver in four of the past five years ... the Pack led the WAC and was seventh in the nation in turnover margin last season with a +12 margin ... American Football Monthly called Nevada's pistol offense the "hottest offense in football" last May.



### Fresno State Bulldogs (0-0, 0-0 WAC)

Will retire David Carr's No. 8 jersey in Saturday's game against Sacramento State ... Carr will be in attendance after plans in September of 2005 were canceled due to Hurricanes Rita and Katrina prevented him from traveling to Fresno ... Fresno State allowed just 12 sacks last year, setting a new school record ... the team also set a record last year with just five fumbles ... WR Chastin West is out after suffering an injury in practice ... he was the Bulldogs' leading receiver last year and the only returning wide receiver with more than four catches last year ... senior C Ryan Wendell has started 35 consecutive games for the Bulldogs ... had its seven-year streak of appearing in bowl games snapped last year.



### New Mexico State Aggies (0-0, 0-0 WAC)

Finished last season with a two-game winning streak, its longest since winning three straight toward the end of the 2004 season ... is 85-29-2 all-time in home openers and have won four of its last five ... junior QB Chase Holbrook returns after throwing for a school and NCAA sophomore-record 4,619 yards last year ... he passed for over 300 yards in 10 of 12 games last season and hit the 500-yard mark three times ... junior WR Chris Williams led the nation in receiving last year with 92 receptions for 1,415 yards (12 TDs) ... he also led the WAC in all-purpose yards with 155.1 per game ... senior WR Brandon Allen has caught a pass in 31 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the WAC and 10 games shy of tying the school record.



### (23/24) Hawai'i Warriors (0-0, 0-0 WAC)

Is ranked in the preseason for the first time in school history ... is 3-5 in season openers and 5-2 against FCS opponents under head coach June Jones ... won 10 of its last 11 games in 2006 ... played five games last year without punting ... senior Colt Brennan threw for a NCAA-record 58 TDs last year and needs 28 more to tie the all-time NCAA record of 121 set by BYU's Ty Detmer (1988-91) ... he needs 150 passing yards to reach 10,000 for his career ... his 70.39 career completion percentage is the best in the nation among active QBs ... junior WR Davone Bess has 185 receptions in two seasons, 78 shy of tying the WAC record of 263 ... senior WR Jason Rivers had two TDs and 308 receiving yards in Hawai'i's bowl win last December.



### San Jose State Spartans (0-0, 0-0 WAC)

Has a three-game winning streak heading into the 2007 season ... won nine games last season, its most since going 9-2-1 in 1990 ... the nine wins were more than the Spartans had won in the previous three seasons combined (8) ...
