



## HEAD COACHES

Michael Linenberger enters his 18th year at the helm of the Sacramento State men's soccer program. In 2005, he led the Hornets to a 9-7-2 record and their best finish since 1992. Sacramento State was ruthless at home with an eight-match

unbeaten streak and Linenberger was named co-Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Men's Soccer Coach of the Year. A record six players also received all-conference honors.

He began his coaching career with the Hornets as an assistant in 1988 before taking sole control of the head coaching duties in 1992.

During the 2001 season, Linenberger led the Hornets to their first regular season conference title in the Div. I era (1991-present) with a league record of 4-1-2. Due to his efforts, Linenberger was named 2001 MPSF Men's Soccer Coach of the Year.

# 2006 Boys & Girls Hornet Soccer Camp



Katie Poynter is entering her third season as head coach for the Hornet women's soccer program. In 2005, the team produced its best season since 2000, finishing 8-8-3 and advancing to the Big Sky Tournament. After ending the regular season with a program-best second place finish, seven players received all-Big Sky honors.

Poynter began her coaching career as an assistant coach at Azusa Pacific in 2002, helping lead the Cougars to a 16-4 overall record. The squad also finished as the runner-up in the NAIA national championship game.

As a player, Poynter played three years at UC Irvine (1997-99) where she was a two-time all-Big West selection. In 2001, she transferred to Santa Clara, winning a national championship with the Broncos.



## CAMP DIRECTORS JASON GANTT & RANDY DEDINI



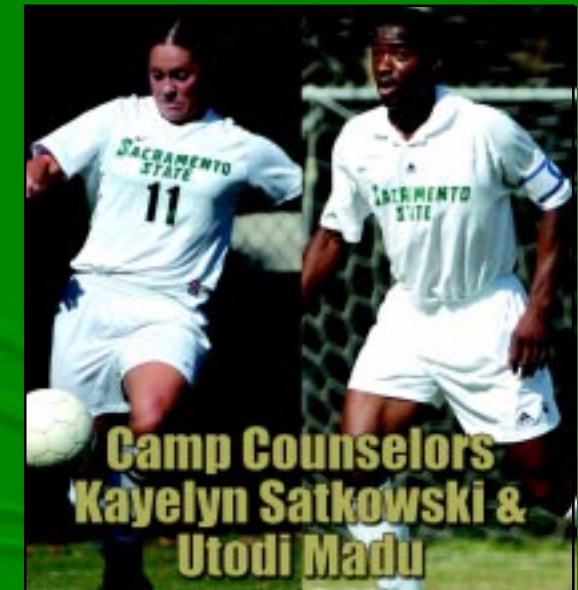
Jason Gantt, who has served as the camp director of the Hornets' summer soccer camps for the past two years, is entering his fifth season as assistant coach of the men's soccer program.

was an All-American goalkeeper at Sonoma State, before playing professionally for 11 seasons in the A-League and MLS. He is currently the director of goalkeeping for Sac United. Dedini also coaches two boys teams (U-17 and U-13) with Sac United.
